General Purpose Funding

Rates

At present an amount of \$727,204 has been raised in rates. A discount of \$48,387 applied. At the end of April, rate debtors outstanding were \$41,799. At this stage I believe the pensioner discount is still to be claimed – this is estimated to be Grant Funding

An adjustment has been made to one of our invoices due to incorrect claim submitted to Main Roads for payment. We have also budgeted for receiving an amount of \$528,000 for RTR3 Special Projects Bridges but this project will not be commencing until next year. This is a timing difference. We have also invoiced Department of Lands for an amount of \$363,176 under the Royalties for Regions Program.

Consultancy Fees

This includes an amount of \$18,373 to Morrison Law for the strategic plan, asset management plan, and forward capital plan as well as \$10,604 to WALGA for recruitment.

Governance

Contributions and Reimbursements

This is over budget due to Council being reimbursed \$2,192 for Peter's long service leave as well as \$5,334 LGIS for adjustments made to our premium.

Conferences

This is the cost of councillors attend local government week.

Printing and Stationery

This amount has exceeded council's annual and includes photocopy paper, envelopes, order books, lever arch files etc.

Postage

This includes the postage for rates which will be transferred to general purpose expenditure.

Law Order Public Safety

Grant and Subsidies

All four grants from FESA have been received.

Purchase plant and equipment

This includes \$4,896 of uhv radios being purchased and installed in Shire machinery. We are looking to recoup this expenditure through a ELS grant.

Maintenance of Land and Buildings

This includes works carried out to the Cuballing Fire Station and payments of rates for building.

Other goods and services

This includes 20litres of class "A" foam which is required when fighting building fires such as hay sheds etc.

Community Amenities

Refuse site maintenance

This amount is under budget but this is a timing difference.

Recreation & Culture

Grants

This is a \$20,000 grant received under the Dry Season Assistant Grant scheme for the year. This amount was not budgeted for.

Dryandra Region Grant and Contributions

At present, an amount of \$45,000 has been received from various sources for this project ie Pony Club, Equestrian Centre etc.

Cuballing Recreation Centre and Oval Maintenance

Costs that have been coded here have to be reallocated.

Reserve Maintenance

This is another timing difference that will be adjusted over time.

Transport

Profit(Loss) on Sale of Assets

As the kubota tractor was written down to zero, there was a profit of \$6,818 on this item, whilst the Works Supervisor Vehicle incurred a loss of (\$6,093).

Sale of Scrap

No amount had been budgeted for this item, however, items surplus to requirements from the depot were put out for tender and the amount of \$4,052 was received.

Depot Maintenance, Grading and General Maintenance, Bridges and Culverts

These items are timing differences and will be adjusted as the year progresses.

Traffic Signs

This amount has exceeded the budget figure due to various traffic control signs and road modification road signs required to be purchased due to change in standards.

Purchase of Road Plant

This is less than the budgeted profit as the trucks purchases/changeover has not gone through until April.

Other Property and Services

Private Works

This month saw private works increase over the budgeted amount due to the completion of a house pad at a cost of \$24,066.

Sick Pay

Several of the outside staff have had time off due off due to health reasons. They are all back at work at present.

Holiday Pay and Long Service Pay and Admin Sick and Holiday Pay

Various staff members have had holidays and Peter's payout for long service leave and holidays have been included in these accounts.

Fuels, Oils and Diesel

This amount is less than budgeted at this stage but this is due to a timing difference.

Tyres and batteries

This amount is over budget due to tyres being replaced on plant items.

Parts and Repairs

This is over budget due to the following items being purchased:

- grader blades of \$8,670
- repairs to Isuzu truck at a cost of \$4,216

Background

Correspondence has been received from the Northern Country Zone of WALGA regarding the State Barrier Fence No 3. This fence currently helps to protect farm land from the encroachment of migrating emus from the pastoral regions.

The fence is currently constructed to Emu Proof standard and the proposed works are to upgrade the fence to wild dog standard with the inclusion of a lap wire which will help to prevent kangaroos from burrowing under the fence and allowing dogs to enter protected areas. The project involves 572km of upgraded fencing and the budgeted cost is approximately \$460,000,which includes grading.

Successful negotiations with the State Government have resulted in the State supplying the fencing materials through the Country Local Government Fund. The State expects the responsibility for the upgrading of this section of fence to be carried out by other interests, eg. Farmers and Local Governments.

The Northern Country Zone is requesting this project be included in our Country Local Government Fund Regional Projects component. They are asking for a contribution of \$3,000.

Comment

Whilst this is no doubt a worthy project, we are being presented with yet another example of cost shifting from State to Local Government and each time Local Government capitulates and takes on the responsibility for a task, they leave themselves vulnerable to increased unsustainability.

In this area of the wheatbelt, we are faced with problems from feral pigs, kangaroos and rabbits, which we have to deal with.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATION:

For Council consideration.

COUNCIL DECISION:

That The Northern Country Zone of WALGA be advised: That;

- Whilst Council sympathises with their plight,t there is asignificant amount of work to be undertaken to deal with our feral pig, rabbit and kangaroo issues; and
- Council is not prepared to submit to a further example of cost shifting from Government.
