PRESIDENT'S PEN

Council elections have been run and won with new faces elected to Council after Roger Newman and Tim Haslam did not seek reelection. The two retiring Councillors combined for a total of 33 years of experience serving on Council: 21 years for Roger including 11 years as Deputy President and 12 years for Tim. Although the length of service is admirable it was the quality of service that made both exceptionable contributors to our community.

Roger Newman, the Councillor, would always offer a considered opinion during discussions and often questioned the impact of Council decisions on those less well-off in our community. He has extensive expertise in machinery and equipment and brought those skills to plant replacement decisions. Perhaps his greatest strength was to map a calm, logical and clearly explained approach particularly to controversial issues.


Tim Haslam, the Councillor, would spend many hours thinking through the issues, even away from meetings, and would often bring further clarity to discussions. He was concerned with equity and fairness, and tenacious if these values were challenged. He was quite forthright at times and didn't shirk away from making hard decisions that benefited the whole of the community.

Thank-you gentlemen for your contributions to our shire and I wish you well in the future.

Regeneration of Councils is an exciting time and congratulations to incoming Councillors Rob Harris and Deb Hopper joining sitting Councillor Dawson Bradford for the next four years on Council. Congratulations must also go to all candidates for being brave enough to nominate and provide genuine choices for electors in a ballot that saw 33% voter turn-out, 3% higher than the state average. I look forward to the new ideas and contributions that will shape our Council's thinking into the future.

CEMETERIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Shire of Cuballing is establishing a Cemeteries Advisory Committee to make recommendations to Council about the management of the two operating cemeteries at Cuballing and Popanyinning.

The Cemeteries Committee will advise Council on matters relating to the Popanyinning Cemetery, the Cuballing Cemetery, lonely and heritage graves, niche facilities, the Shire of Cuballing Cemeteries Local Law 1998 generally, including but not limited to;

- Fees and charges;
- Maintenance quality, practices and procedures;
- Infrastructure requirements;
- Design elements;
- Relevant and required Policies;
- Availability of supply; and
- Trends in cemetery management and community expectations and needs.

The Committee would promote and identify opportunities for development and enhancement of cemeteries, remembrance gardens and niche facilities.

The Committee will include one Shire Councillor and six local community members with an interest in our local cemeteries. It is expected that the Committee will meet at least twice a year.

219 valid ballot papers were received which representing 34% of all voters listed on the Council Electoral Roll.

While 104 people either used a postal vote or early voted at the Shire Office prior to election day, 62 people voted in Cuballing and 53 voted in Popanyinning on Election Day.

NEW COUNCILLORS

The newly elected Shire Councillors Deb Hopper and Robert Harris were sworn in as Shire Councillors before Jurgen Brander JP prior to a Special Council Meeting on Monday 24th October 2019. Re-elected Shire Councillor Dawson Bradford was also sworn in.

The newly elected Shire Councillors receive a 4 year term as Shire Councillor, serving until 21st October 2023.

Later in the meeting the Councillors re-elected Councillor Mark Conley as Shire President and Councillor Eliza Dowling as Deputy Shire President.

FIRE SAFETY—FIREBREAKS

The Shire of Cuballing requires that property owners maintain their properties in a fire safe manner with fire breaks or reduced fuel loads from 1st November 2019 until 15th May 2020.

For owners of rural or larger rural residential properties this means installing and maintaining a 2.5 metre wide fire break.

For smaller town site properties this means mowing down long grass across all the property.

Shire staff will be inspecting firebreaks around the Shire commencing on 1st November.

COUNCIL SHORTS

At the October 2019 Ordinary Meeting of Council:

- Cr Eliza Dowling was nominated again for the position of local government representative Inland on the Peel Harvey Catchment Council;
- Council adopted draft Bush Fire Brigade Local Laws. These laws will now be progressed though a community consultation process;
- Council agreed to accept the offer South West Isuzu to purchase the Shire six wheel tipper for \$57,272. This sale will be purchase for a new prime mover from South West Isuzu for \$162,040 being a total cost of \$105,176 with the trade-in.
- Council agreed upon a new employment contract with Manager Works & Services, Mr Bruce Brennan, upon expiry of his existing employment contract.

TENDER PURCHASES

Council is currently completing the purchase by tender of:

- supply of cement stabilisation and wet mixing services for road construction projects on Wandering Narrogin Road and Stratherne
 Road. Western Stabilisers Pty Ltd were selected as the preferred tenderer.
- A side tipping semi-trailer. This trailer will be the second purchased by Council and will be used with a new prime mover that is being

purchased by Council from South West Isuzu. This tender was being reissued because staff did not allow the required time between advertising and closing the tender; and

A semi-trailer water tanker. A semi trailer water tanker will be more adaptable for use with Council's prime mover trucks. The larger capacity tank will also assist in provide larger quantities of water to remote locations in the Shire and when providing water to bushfire incidents.

The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in the Shire of Cuballing.

The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards promote National Pride,

Community Responsibility and Participation.

Guidelines and Criteria

Each year a local citizen and one local community group will be eligible for the Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards.

The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year, or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Eligibility Criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the Shire of Cuballing making the award.
- Awards may not be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
- Staff of the Shire of Cuballing are not eligible

Nomination Process

The Shire of Cuballing invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. The Shire of Cuballing may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has been brought about positive change and added value to community life
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.
- The Councillors of the Shire of Cuballing will select the winners from the nominations received.
- The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship award will be presented at the Annual Shire of Cuballing Australia Day event.



NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



River Action Plan Site Assessments



We have had a busy week completing the Hotham-Williams River Action Plan site assessments where we identified the assets, attributes and threats to the health of 7 sites along the Hotham and Williams River at Ranford Pool in Boddington, Pumphreys Bridge, Hotham River Nature Reserve, Popanyinning, Williams, Boraning, and Quindanning.

The purpose of the River Action Plan is to identify priority actions and projects to help protect the ecosystem health and function of the Hotham and Williams Rivers and their abutting Riparian zone.

Over the week we had a total of 16 helpers including PHCC (staff and volunteers), Urbaqua, Newmont Gold Corp and local landholders.

A big thank you to all the landholders who allowed us to gain access to the river through their properties, it was very helpful and saved us a lot of walking. The river health assessments will occur later in October.

Narrogin Agricultural Show

PHCC had a great day at the Narrogin Show where we shared a stall with Project Numbat and the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (Parks and Wildlife Services).

We spent the day speaking with landholders and interested community members about our current projects. We also held a Numbat colouring in competition which was a hit with the kids - congratulations to all the winners.

On Farm Surface and Sub Surface Water Workshop

A successful workshop was held on 20th September in Williams to provide farmers with different strategies for on-farm surface and subsurface water management to improve crop productivity.

The workshop included a farm visit to the Fowler family "Crossman Farm" to view their water management practices which include a combination of interceptor banks, conservation fencing on hilltops and planting (and fencing) the valley floor with native vegetation.

This event was funded through PHCC's Greening Farms project.

AFRICAN SWINE FEVER

Let's keep ASF out of Australia.

The Cuballing Shire is home to around 10% of Western Australia's pork production with as many as seven local farming families involved in the industry. We need to safeguard these operations. They support local businesses and grain growers and provide employment opportunities in the area.

African swine fever (ASF) is the biggest biosecurity threat Australia has faced for many years. There is no vaccination or cure for the virus and it has an almost 100% fatality rate for the pigs it infects. Already 25% of the world's pig population has been wiped out by ASF. The disease is on our doorstep with the virus detected in pigs in Timor Leste, which is only around 700 kilometres from Australia.

Although the disease is highly contagious to pigs there is no threat to human health or food safety from ASF so pork producers are urging consumers to **keep eating pork**.

Pork producers have stepped up biosecurity on their properties, but they cannot keep the disease out of Australia on their own and they need help from everyone in the community especially travellers, hunters and people living in regional areas. The virus can be transferred through clothes, shoes, water, feed, faeces, semen, urine, vehicles, knives, biting flies and ticks, from pork products being fed to pigs and spread by vermin and birds.

An outbreak of ASF in Australia would result in international trade restrictions which will eventually impact on other commodities as our reputation for being clean and green would be damaged.

Pork producers are asking everyone to be extra careful when disposing of food. Make sure it cannot be picked up by another bird or animal and carried into a piggery. Please don't drive on to a piggery without checking with the owners first and don't bring pork products with you. That ham sandwich could inadvertently bring the whole industry to its knees if it happens to be contaminated with the ASF virus.

Feral pigs have been a major source of infection in Europe. If ASF got in our feral pig population it would be very hard to eradicate. It is important that hunters dispose of feral pigs properly and do not transport live or slaughtered pigs inappropriately. Feral pigs are Declared Pests in Western Australia so landholders must manage them correctly.

We might think it is unlikely that ASF will find a foothold in Australia but already 27 tonnes of pork products have been confiscated at the border and in recent weeks almost 50% of those products have been contaminated with the ASF virus. We don't want to take chances with animal health or our trading reputation. The flow on impact to local communities would be severe.

Now is the time to be extra careful and vigilant. Any suspicious symptoms in pigs can be reported to the Emergency Animal Disease (EAD) hotline number on **1800 675 888**.

Please help us keep Australia ASF free.

African swine fever (ASF) is a very real threat to the sustainability of local farms and the health and welfare of pigs. ASF is a highly contagious and deadly viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, currently spreading through China and South East Asia. There is no cure.

Australia remains free of ASF - and we want to stay that way. An outbreak in Australia would devastate the Australian pork industry and have flow on effects throughout our communities.

It's important to remember that people can't "catch" ASF from pigs or from pork – it is not harmful in any way to people.

Pork is safe to eat.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- Report sightings of feral pigs to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD)
- If you own pigs, ensure you have a biosecurity plan, and that you comply with the mandatory pig traceability requirements (www.pigpass.australiapork.com.au/faq).
- Adhere to farm biosecurity requirements if you are an employee or a business that supplies materials or services to pig farms.
- If you are a pig hunter ensure all vehicles, clothing and equipment is washed and disinfected after hunting trips.
- Report the GPS location of any groups of dead feral pigs to the EAD Hotline 1800 675888.
- Don't bring pork products into Australia from overseas.
- Don't feed pigs pet food, food scraps or waste containing meat – <u>swill feeding is</u> <u>illegal</u> in Australia and serious penalties apply.
- Don't leave food scraps containing meat in the bush after hunting or camping trips.

CUBALLING VOLUNTEER ACTION GROUP


We had a successful verge clean up between the Cemetery and Grout Road. 16 bags of rubbish were collected altogether. 10 recyclable 6 non-recyclable.

OUR HISTORY—CUBALLING RAIL STATION

The Cuballing station commenced as a siding called Cuballing Pool on the Great Southern Railway. The 1894 Gazetteer quotes it as being 187 miles from Albany (not Perth), the rail fare from that centre being 32 shillings.

Interest in Cuballing station was very strong in 1896. On 8 August that year material for fencing the station was on hand and the Western Australian Land Company was requested to proceed. The fence was duly erected with two large gates leading into the weighbridge and two more gates and the separate

turnstile opposite hotel. These gates were closed each night, leaving the turnstile for the use of passengers coming and going by the late trains. fence completely The enclosed the station yard with the exception of the stockyards where stock were held until loaded into trucks ready to be taken away by train. The main thoroughfare, Alton Street, was illuminated at night by very grand carbide lights which Caesar Lyons lit each night for many a year.

The Railway Department later built a new long, wide platform and a loop line

behind the Cuballing station from signal to signal. This was to accommodate the costly blunder the Government had made in granting the Wickepin rail link to Narrogin instead of Cuballing. It was found that railway locomotives could pull only 350 tons over the Chuggamunning Hill (the highest point on the Great Southern) from Narrogin but once at Cuballing they could haul 700 tons to Perth. Hence, the loop line was used to hold half a train until the next half train arrived, after which the two were combined.

After June 1930, with the station downgraded to a siding, George Senior was re-appointed as caretaker

until 1947, living in the railway house. The upsurge of goods being hauled led to Cuballing being once again upgraded to fully attended station. The staff worked eight-hour shifts around the clock as some thirty trains came through each day.

Throughout the years much of the station work was done by the safe -working porters whose duties included ensuring that trains got


