

### EARLY AUTUMN IN THE GARDEN by Peter Denton of Chedoona nursery Cuballing

Following recent rains and cooling conditions now is the time to plant new shrubs and trees for the garden. Of course; we have early weeds too, not so welcome for some! Whilst the ground is still warm, early planting enables early root development and growth before the winter slows things down. A little too soon of course for fruit and rose bush pruning. Natives and other waterwise plants are a certain choice, be sure not to plant species that will struggle with our drying climate. Plants local to your area are the obvious choice.

Thinking of a hedge? Old Man saltbush, [Atriplex nummularia] of which most of us are familiar forms a very hardy dense hedge, drought tolerant, prunes well and is generally readily available.

Don't be afraid to plant the humble gum tree in your garden. There are many small growing, non invasive beautiful flowering gum trees available, such as Eucalyptus erythronema, erythrocorys, kruseana, websteriana, and synandra. Maybe even a Desert Quandong tree. What can be more Aussie than that!

Planting now will mean a good watering twice a week to ensure plants don't dry out in the lead up to winter.

Try a variety of native plants; no need to stick to the "run of the mill syndrome", there are heaps of melaleucas, hakeas, grevilleas, calothamnus and many more native varieties now readily available in the market place.

Prepare your garden beds for the winter vegetables, use plenty of good compost and have mulches on hand. Cow and composted sheep manure are ideal to add when digging the beds.

Since there was a positive response St. Johns Ambulance is happy to re-run the training at any time. So call and put your name down if you are interested.

The Men's Shed WA is a not for profit organisation started with the intention of helping men by providing a safe place to air their views and be productive in their own way. The Cuby Men's Shed has been going strong for quite a few years. The Cuby Women's Shed is under the aegis of the Cuby Men's Shed. 

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



### How to find Numbats in your Neighbourhood...

Through our Numbat Neighbourhood Project we have been working in collaboration with Tangents TV to create a video to help landholders determine if they have numbats living in their on-farm habitat. To view the video please go to the Peel-Harvey Catchment Council's Youtube channel.

As the numbat population increases numbats will start to move out of Dryandra Woodland and into onfarm habitat. We had a report from a Wandering local who saw a numbat by their front gate! The 'How to Find Numbats in Your Neighbourhood' video will help landholders to identify numbat traces including digs and scats and apply this knowledge to determine if they have numbats in their own on-farm vegetation. The video also helps landholders to

identify echidna and woylie diggings and scats.

Tamara Wilkes-Jones, who features in the video, has years of experience identifying fauna traces after being involved in the annual Numbat Dig survey in Dryandra Woodland and the Boyagin Nature Reserve. Tamara has helped PHCC deliver a Numbat Dig ID Workshop for the past two years, which has been well supported by local landholders and it is great that this information has been captured and can be accessed by all of the landholders surrounding Dryandra.

We've also created a shorter video to raise awareness of numbats, their threats and how PHCC is working with project partners and the community to ensure that the trajectory of the numbat population in Dryandra Woodland improves.

#### Cockatoo signs to prevent vehicle strikes

Death or injury by vehicle strike is a very real threat to our iconic Black Cockatoos.

Black Cockatoos come to the ground on the side of roads to feed on seeds and drink from puddles after rain. As they are a large bird with big wings they need lots of space and time to take off, putting them in the path of vehicles.

We ask motorists to safely slow down when you see Black Cockatoos on or near the road, to reduce the likelihood of vehicle strike, by allowing the birds time to fly out of the way.

Signs are being placed on roadsides within the Shire of Boddington at Black Cockatoo feeding and drinking hotspots by Friends of the Reserves - Boddington (Inc.) volunteers, to remind motorists to slow down. There have been several recent Black

Cockatoos deaths by vehicle strike in the area.

All three species of Black Cockatoo (Forest Red-Tailed, Baudin's and Carnaby's) are threatened so any death is a blow to the survival prospects of the species.

If you come across an injured bird please phone Kaarakin on 9390 2288 or Wildcare on 9474 9055 to locate your nearest wildlife rehabilitator, or alternatively take it to the nearest vet if safe to do so. Cover the bird with a towel or something similar and place in a ventilated box if possible. Remember your safety on the road is priority.

Our Black Cockatoo project is supported through funding from the Australian Government's Environmental Restoration Fund.

### Restoring Tunbridge Gully

The native species are making a comeback in Tunbridge Gully!

The Tunbridge Gully restoration project in Boddington is showing great signs of success with the new seedlings planted over the last few years dominating throughout the area. This joint project between South32, the PHCC, Friends of the Reserves - Boddington (Inc.), Boddington District High School, Newmont Australia and the Shire of Boddington aims to restore the natural ecosystem and improve water quality through the removal of the invasive weed Juncus acutus (Spiny rush) and planting of native seedlings.

The first round of weed spraying was undertaken in 2017, followed by cool burn in 2018 to assist with the control of the invasive weed. Since then an annual spraying program has occurred to have maximum effect on the weeds. The 7ha area has seen over 22,000 seedlings planted, which have been a mixture of trees, shrubs and understory species. This has all been possible through a massive 415 volunteer hours that have occurred to date by the amazing Boddington District High School students and other Hotham-Williams volunteers through our annual community planting events.

These combined activities along the creekline from the Boddington town dam site through to the Hotham River foreshore are proving fruitful with recent weed survey results showing a decline in Juncus acutus area from 5.84 hectares in 2015 to only 1.98 hectares in December 2020 (Mattiske Consulting, 2021). The two weed species most prevalent were Juncus acutus and Asparagus asparagoides (Bridal Creeper).

As native vegetation grows and creates a canopy across the creekline, *Juncus acutus* will

continue to decline. Ongoing yearly ecological and photo monitoring will be conducted by PHCC and volunteers throughout the area to track the success of this program.

This project is coordinated by Peel-Harvey Catchment Council through funding South32 Worsley Alumina, and in partnership with Friends of the Reserves - Boddington (Inc.), Boddington District High School, Newmont Australia and the Shire of Boddington.



## EASTER COLOURING IN



#### EASTER CHOCOLATE BARK



- Prep 20 minutes
- \* Cook: 5 minutes plus cooling
- Makes enough for 6-8 giftbags

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- \* 3 x 200g bars milk chocolate
- \* 2 x 90g packs mini chocolate eggs
- 1 heaped tsp freeze-dried raspberry pieces – or you could use crystallised petals

#### **METHOD**

#### STEP 1

Break the chocolate into a large heatproof bowl. Bring a pan of water to a simmer, then sit the bowl on top. The water must not touch the bottom of the bowl. Let the chocolate slowly melt, stirring now and again with a spatula. For best results, temper your chocolate (see tip).

#### STEP 2

Meanwhile, lightly grease then line a 23 x 33cm roasting tin or baking tray with parchment. Put three-quarters of the mini eggs into a food bag and bash them with a rolling pin until broken up a little.

#### STEP 3

When the chocolate is smooth, pour it into the tin. Tip the tin from side to side to let the chocolate find the corners and level out. Scatter with the smashed and whole mini eggs, followed by the freeze-dried raspberry pieces. Leave to set, then remove from the parchment and snap into shards, ready to pack in boxes or bags.

#### **RECIPE TIPS**

Tempering chocolate is the process of heating then cooling chocolate to form a specific type of crystals in the cocoa butter. If we simply melt and cool shop- bought chocolate, it will quickly 'bloom', with dots and streaks of cocoa butter. It melts quickly when touched too. Tempered chocolate will quickly set hard and shiny, won't bloom, and shrinks as it cools, making it easy to remove from a mould. Here's a simple method: Break up 3/4 of the chocolate into a heatproof bowl. Melt until it is flowing and smooth. White chocolate should reach 43C, milk and dark 45C. Add the remaining chocolate, chopped into small pieces. Stir with a spatula until the pieces have melted and the thermometer shows 28C for milk and white, 30C for dark. This can take a while, so have patience and keep stirring. Use as soon as possible. If the chocolate starts to get too cold and thick as you use it, heat for just a few seconds and stir well.


