


All meetings are open to the public and will commence at 2.00pm with fifteen minute Public Question Time at the commencement of each meeting.

PROPOSED CAT LOCAL LAW

On 16 March 2022 the ABC published an article detailing the impact of Foxes and cats on Australian Wildlife. The article reported the findings of research supported by the Threatened Species Recovery Hub.

The Graphic below illustrates the extent of the impact of foxes and feral cats, but also the additional impact of domestic cats.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SETS ITS AGENDA FOR THE FEDERAL ELECTION

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) is the peak body for Local Government in Australia. In the lead up to the Federal Election ALGA has launched its campaign seeking commitments from all parties to the sectors Key Priorities. At its March meeting the Shire of Cuballing endorsed the campaign priorities. The campaign has 5 key themes:

An effective way to kickstart the economy is through a cash injection for Local Government. ALGA is proposing a \$1.3 billion boost and returning Financial Assistance Grants to 1% of Commonwealth revenue.




Reinstating local government representation to National Cabinet in Ministerial forums.

In total (including direct and flow-on impacts), the funding priorities ALGA has proposed are estimated to contribute at least \$6.46 billion per annum on average to Australia's Gross Domestic Product (GDP), as well as support an average of 43,444 full time equivalent (FTE) jobs per annum across Australia over a four-year period. By working with Australian councils – the level of government closest to its community – a future Federal Government can put steps in place to guarantee no local community is left behind as we recover from COVID-19



Pulse oximeter What you need to know!







If you answered YES to any of the above – collect a free pulse oximeter from your local government today!

What is a pulse oximeter?

It is a small, peg-like device that clips onto your fingertip to read your heart rate and blood oxygen level. It takes only one minute to work, is reusable and can be shared between other people in your household.

Why do I need one?

If you become COVID-19 positive, you may need to be remotely monitored through the WA COVID Care at Home program. By having a pulse oximeter already in your home, a health professional can assess you and provide health advice from the comfort of your home.

Visit WA COVID Care at Home for more information.

Where do I get one?

Visit your local government to collect a free pulse oximeter for you and your household (each eligible household can receive one pulse oximeter but supplies are limited).

Do not pick up a pulse oximeter if you are already COVID-19 positive. If you have already received a positive COVID-19 test result, the Department of Health will contact you and provide further information.

Crime Stoppers urge locals to hand in unwanted or unregistered firearms

Say something before it's too late!

WA residents are being urged to "say something before it's too late" in a campaign aimed at getting illegal guns off the streets.

In Mandurah on Wednesday, 9 March 2022, Crime Stoppers WA and WA Police kicked off phase 2 of a six-month national illegal firearms campaign which is aimed at removing as many unregistered guns from the community.

Phase 1 of the campaign, which ran from July to September last year, encouraged people with an unregistered gun to surrender it without penalty.

Phase 2 of the campaign now encourages people who know any information about an illegal gun to report it confidentially and safely to Crime Stoppers.

From 1 July 2021 to 1 March 2022, a total of 1,250 firearms and gun parts have been handed in to WA Police along with 35,183 rounds of ammunition. The 1,250 firearms and gun parts have included 126 hand guns, 245 shot guns and a total of 879 rifles and gun parts.

Crime Stoppers WA CEO Dr Vince Hughes said a range of community engagement and promotional events would be held throughout metropolitan and regional centres of Western Australia, all with a view to encouraging people to share what they know about illegal guns and to

safely surrender any they may have in their possession.

"Illegal guns are more likely to be used in crime, more likely to be defective or insecurely stored, and more likely to be involved in accidents," Dr Hughes said. "There is no excuse – indeed no legitimate reason – for anyone in Western Australia to have an illegal firearm."

"Our message today is simple – if you have an illegal firearm, do the right thing; do the right thing by your friends, family and the community – hand it in."






