Popanyinning is one of the few places that has two cemeteries, one that is in use today (I am sure many of us can tell the stories of the hard work that was made to re opened after it was closed) and a pioneer cemetery which stopped been used in 1911.

For anyone wanting to visit the Pioneer Cemetery it is located at the end of York street in Popanyinning. For years a local Popanyinning family have kept watch over it and tending to the graves when needed.



In late 2021 Outback Graves (a not for profit organisation who are working tirelessly around Western Australia to bring a story and name to every unmarked grave) contacted the Shire of

Cuballing after they stumbled upon the cemetery, they were very keen to supply engraved plaques for all graves located along the river bed.

On Wednesday the 8th of June this project finally came to fruition with the team from Outback Graves meeting on site to proudly install the newly engraved plaques next to original headstones or for the ones that didn't have headstones, in the place they are believed to be graves.


The Community Builders Program is a good timing for Cuballing as we are about to develop a new community strategic plan. Council will be looking for YOUR input into the plan and will be asking you;

COMMUNITY SPORTING AND RECREATION FACILITIES FUND (CSRFF) and CLUB NIGHT LIGHT PROGRAM (CNLP) 2022/23 JULY SMALL GRANTS FUNDING ROUND

The CSRFF 2022/23 July Small Grants round and Club Night Lights Program is now open for projects with a value of \$300,000 or below.

To be eligible, prospective Wheatbelt applicants must contact the DLGSC Wheatbelt Office to discuss eligibility for funding, advice, assistance in preparing the submission and to obtain an application form.

Cuballing Applications must be submitted to the Shire of Cuballing by 1 August 2022 for consideration at the August 2022 Council meeting prior to lodgement with the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries no later than Wednesday 31 August 2022.

It is very important that applicants can demonstrate that their project will be completed and the grant satisfactorily acquitted within the proposed timeframe. Applicants must take into account potential delays in construction and escalating building costs as part of the application process. It is expected that applicants will complete their projects on time and deferrals should not be expected because of delays in the construction process or cost escalation.



There is no safe level of alcohol use, as any level increases the risk of developing an alcohol-caused cancer. The more you drink,



and the more often you drink, the greater your risk. To reduce your cancer risk, the message is avoid alcohol.


