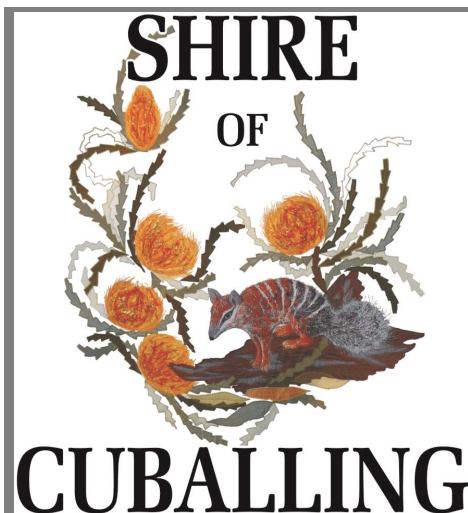
Council is considering an application to permit the operation of a Smash Repair and wrecking business at 48 Schoolars Road, Cuballing.

COUNCIL SHORTS

Railway land in Cuballing Town Centre

For a long time the Shire has been looking to formalise access to land in the railway corridor in Cuballing. This land could be better utilised with a clear lease or license arrangement that would allow the Shire and the community to make better use of this space.

Arc Infrastructure, the rail operator, has offered the Shire a license to occupy the land subject to a range of conditions. Council has voted to accept the license subject to satisfactory resolution of a couple of conditions.

Local Emergency Management Arrangements

Every Council is required to have a Local Emergency Management Plan, together with a broad based committee to develop and implement the plan. For some years the Shires of Cuballing and Wickpin have shared a Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC) and Plan. This will continue unless replaced by a better arrangement. Council decided that there is room for improvement in our arrangements and decided:

- To develop a Cuballing Shire Specific Plan;
- To approach Narrogin and Wickpin with a view to having a joint committee across the 3 Shires – each with individual plans; and
- Approach the Dryandra Regional Equestrian Centre to seek agreement for the Centre to be used as an equine evacuation centre in an emergency.

Cuballing Golf Club Upgrade

The Cuballing Golf Club has been enjoying increasing membership and has undertaken significant improvements on the course over recent years. Following a successful outing at the annual LGIS golf tournament Cuballing will be hosting the 2023 edition of the event.

Meanwhile the Shire has an allocation under the Local Roads and Community Program that must be expended by 30 June 2023. This will be challenging given the limited availability of contractors. The Golf Club has approached the Shire to seek financial support to develop an outdoor undercover alfresco area to increase the club's event capacity, and this project could be completed in the time available.

Council has agreed to provide \$50,000 to support this project, with the balance of funds coming from the Golf Club.

COUNCIL SHORTS

Council Camping Policy

Council has undertaken a long overdue review of its camping policy. Yornaning Dam used to be a popular camping spot but was becoming degraded due to a lack of controls on camping and access. As a result, camping was prohibited.

Since 2017 the Shire of Cuballing, with support from Peel Harvey Catchment Council, Wheatbelt Cycling Collective and the State NRM program, has been undertaking upgrade and rehabilitation of Yornaning Dam. This culminated in the Shire being recognised as the State Winner of the Environmental Sustainability Category of the Tidy Towns Awards. Now this work is complete and vehicle access is contained within a specific area it is now possible to safely allow camping by self-contained campers. Council took this opportunity to review its policy on camping on Council property. Camping is now permitted for up to 3 nights without a permit at each of the Yornaning Dam, Popanyinning Oval and opposite the Cuballing Roadhouse.

Council has also identified other locations where camping may be allowed with a permit.

New Storage Shed in Austral Street

Council has approved the development of a Storage Facility at a vacant block in Austral Street. The land has been owned for several years by General Steel Products. The storage facility will support General Steel Products shed erection business and will allow it to store materials closer to its numerous local projects.

The site was previously used as a timber yard and sawmill and can only be used for industrial purposes without substantial remediation. The project will also result in work to clean up the site and make it more aesthetically pleasing.

Strategic Community Plan

Council has kicked off the process for developing a new Strategic Community Plan. Previous plans have been adopted in 2014 and 2017 and have guided Council's efforts in identifying community aspirations and expectations. Previous plans prioritised achieving improved telecommunications, establishing the Dryandra Equestrian Centre, and developing retirement housing in Cuballing. There was also an emphasis on maintaining and increasing the Shire's population, and the latest census figures indicate that the Shire's population has increased by almost 4% between the 2016 and 2021 Census.

Over the next few months, we will be seeking community input into future plans for the Shire. We kicked off this process in a very low-key way with the post cards you will have received recently. If you haven't returned it, please do. If you have lost it, or someone else in your household would like a say, please contact the Shire to get another card.

Like all good plans it will require some visionary and aspirational thinking together with a reality check to ensure plans are realistic and affordable. The best plans have the most community input.

Guidelines and Criteria

Each year a local citizen and one local community group will be eligible for the Shire of Cuballing Citizenship Awards.

The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year, or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Eligibility Criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the Shire of Cuballing making the award.
- Awards may not be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
- Staff of the Shire of Cuballing are not eligible

• Nomination Process

The Shire of Cuballing invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. The Shire of Cuballing may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has been brought about positive change and added value to community life
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.
- The Councillors of the Shire of Cuballing will select the winners from the nominations received.
- The Shire of Cuballing Citizenship award will be presented at the Annual Shire of Cuballing Australia Day event.

Your Legal Responsibilities and Fire Safety Information

As a landowner or occupier you are required under the provisions of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* to carry out fire prevention work on your property. Please read this notice carefully—if there are any points that are not fully understood, please contact the Shire of Cuballing Phone (08) 9883 6031.

This work must be carried out by **31 October 2022** OR WITHIN 14 DAYS OF BECOMING THE OWNER OR OCCUPIER, SHOULD THIS BE AFTER THAT DATE and kept maintained throughout the summer months until **15 May 2023**.

PERSONS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS NOTICE MAY BE ISSUED WITH AN INFRINGEMENT NOTICE OR PROSECUTED. WHERE THE OWNER FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE NOTICE, COUNCIL OR ITS DULY AUTHORISED OFFICERS WILL CARRY OUT THE REQUIRED WORK AT THE COST OF THE OWNER.

IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE CALL 000

DURING THE RESTRICTED PERIOD YOU MUST HAVE A PERMIT FOR ALL FIRES INCLUDING INCINERATORS

If you do not meet your responsibilities as outlined in this brochure, you may be fined a minimum of **\$250** and be required to meet the cost of Council's

efforts to make you comply with this Notice. Ultimately you could be liable for a maximum penalty of **\$5,000**—plus costs.

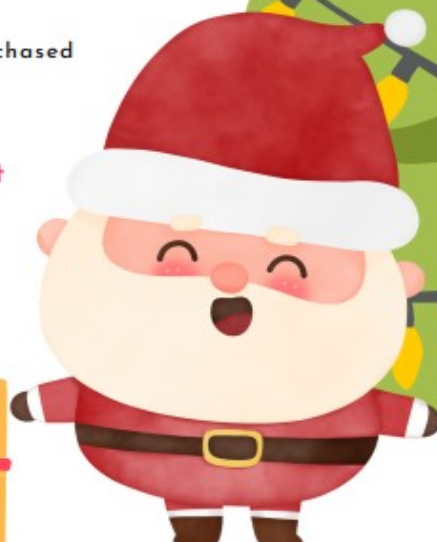

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

- Lung cancer is the third most common cancer affecting both women and men in Western Australia.
- In 2017, 637 Western Australian men and 472 Western Australian women were diagnosed with lung cancer.

Common symptoms of lung cancer include:

- Coughing or spitting up blood (once or more)

Or, for more than four weeks:

- A new cough or change to your usual cough
- Repeated chest infections
- Becoming more short of breath, tired or lacking energy
- Losing weight without trying
- Pain in your chest or shoulder
- Finding it hard to breathe or swallow
- Not feeling hungry.

If you have coughed up blood, even if it was just once, it's important to tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away.

If you have had any of the other symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or health worker. It doesn't mean you've got lung cancer – often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get checked out to be safe.

If it is lung cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Sid's message – 'Slip Slop Slap Seek and Slide' It's National Skin Cancer Action Week 21st – 27th November and with two in three Australians diagnosed with skin cancer by age 70, the action week is an important reminder to use sun protection and of the importance of early skin cancer detection for all Australians as we make our way into summer. It's important to use the five forms of sun protection:

Slip on sun-protective clothing,

Slop on SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen,

Slap on a broad-brimmed hat,

Seek shade,

Slide on sunglasses.

A combination of these measures, along with getting to know your skin and regularly checking for any changes are the keys to reducing your skin cancer risk. 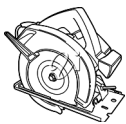
