 - Tell us exactly where to go
- Give an address if you don't know your exact location is there a visual landmark or unusual sound you can tell us about nearby so we can find you?
- Downloading the St John's first responder App which has the exact location coordinates to assist you and the emergency services to locate you.



COUNCIL SHORTS

Cat Local Law

In April this year Council drafted a Cat Local Law. It followed all the statutory procedures and the Local law was adopted in August 2022 and the new rules applies 2 weeks later.

All local laws must be reviewed by the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation. That review discovered that between the commencement of the process in April 2022 and the final adoption of the Local Law in August 2022 one of the pieces of legislation referenced by the Local Law was repealed and replaced by another Act.

What does it all mean? Until we next review the Local Law we must include an addendum on all copies of the Local Law to explain the correction. The provisions around responsible cat ownership remain in place and enforceable.

Meeting dates for 2023

Every year Council is required to advertise its meeting dates at least once.

Council meetings for 2023 will be held at 2 pm on the third Wednesday of each month except January. All meetings are held in the Council Chambers at 22 Campbell St Cuballing except for the May 2023 meeting which will be held at the Popanyinning Town Hall. All meetings are open to the public and will include the opportunity for public questions and submissions. If you have never been to a Council Meeting maybe add it to your bucket list.

Council also has a Cemeteries advisory Committee which now meets twice a year in April and October.

Cuballing Cemetery

Speaking of Cemeteries, do you know where the bodies are buried at the Cuballing Cemetery? Well as it happens so do we, but in some cases we don't know which is which. Some old records have been lost identifying who is occupying which grave.

The Shire intends to ensure that every grave is marked with details of the occupant, so if you know something please let us know. We will be relying on the best information available to us by 31 December this year to place markers on unmarked graves.

Planning Approval for Panel Beating, Spray Painting and Vehicle Wrecking

Jack O'Connell has been approved to operate a Panel Beating, Spray Painting and Vehicle Wrecking business from his property in Schoolars Road in Cuballing. Jack tells us that it will be small scale and will mostly involve restoring old vehicles.

The Shire of Cuballing invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. The Shire of Cuballing may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience


Selection Criteria

The Shire of Cuballing with the support of the State Government's Royalties for Regions Program has almost completed the construction of 4 Independent Living Units in Austral Street in Cuballing. These 3-bedroom, air-conditioned units will be available for rent early in 2023.

The purpose of the units is to allow Cuballing residents who want to retire to be able to remain in Cuballing and not have to move away to retire. The units are only available to people over 65 (or over 60 with a disability) and able to live independently with or without a carer.

Units will be rented using a standard tenancy agreement under the Residential Tenancy Act.



Popanyinning - Hard to say, nice to stay!


The small town of Popanyinning is close to the eastern extent of the Peel-Harvey Catchment and home to one of eight Hotham-Williams River Action Plan (RAP) sites which we have been introducing you to in recent months.

The Hotham River is located between the township to the west and small rural landholdings to the east, in turn bound by broad scale agricultural land in the surrounding landscape. The RAP site spans 1.2km along the River and is characterised by a narrow meandering channel form, scattered tree species and a sparse native shrub layer intermingled with both exotic and native grasses. A large pool existed on the Hotham River close to where the town is now situated, and according to the WA Heritage Committee, the original name of 'Popaning' is a representation of the word for waterhole in the Noongar language.

Weed control has recently been carried out at the site to target bridal creeper and other timely weeds within the area earmarked for strategic effort this season and the use of an all-terrain vehicle by Nexxial Ecology meant that we were not restricted by site conditions. The Popanyinning Progress Association has been working in natural areas along the River for many years, and some of them met with Nexxial Ecology on-site to get the lowdown on the latest control methods for bridal creeper. The group is assisting in an area where they have previously concentrated their efforts, putting a significant dent in the population of this troublesome weed.

By seeking additional funding and partnerships, PHCC would like to increase the scope of weed control efforts in future seasons to assist the natural regeneration of existing native species at the site, including grasses and orchids.

Another successful season of Carnaby breeding

Carnaby pairs return to nest in Mandurah and Lake Clifton

In 2021 with the addition of cockatubes on private property we saw an increase in the number of breeding pairs of Carnaby's Black Cockatoos. Recent surveys have seen the same number of pairs of Carnaby's return to known breeding hollows in Mandurah (5 pairs) and Lake Clifton (2 pairs).

Whilst artificial nest tubes placed in the correct locations can provide fantastic alternative breeding hollows they do have their limitations, such as needing to be regularly maintained and monitored. The retention of natural tree hollows is undeniably paramount in preventing a decline in Black Cockatoo populations.

Natural breeding hollows are often found in trees upwards of 150 years old, and with age comes significant risk of collapse. We not only need to protect these veteran trees to keep them upright in the landscape for as long as possible, but also protect the next generation of trees, that will hollow out in time to replace their grandfathers.

You can help by retaining all large trees, fencing trees from stock, and planting small shrubs and ground covers to protect roots, provide ideal soil conditions and avoid compaction.




