Two Councillors Elected Unopposed One Position Remaining

At the close of nominations for the Local Government Elections for Cuballing for 2023 only two candidates had nominated for the 3 vacant positions.

Returning Officer Sarah Hawksley declared the two candidates elected unopposed. The Two Candidates are:



Cr Rob Harris, Deputy Shire President. This will be Rob's second term on Council. He has represented the Shire on Central Country Zone and the Regional Roads Group, and is also a board member of the Peel Harvey Catchment Council. Rob will continue for another 4 year term.



Mr Scott Ballantyne. Scott will take up his position following the scheduled date of the election, 21 October 2023. Scott has previously served two terms as a Councillor, and has been an independent member of the Audit Committee for the last 2 years. He will also serve a 4 year term.

There will be an Extraordinary Election to fill the remaining vacancy on 16 December 2023. Nominations open on 20 October and close on 26 October 2023. The CEO will be the Returning Officer

PRESIDENT'S PEN





Solving WA's Housing Crisis

A lot has been said about the housing shortage in WA. Not just in Perth or regional centres but throughout WA.

Businesses would like to employ more staff, but they can't find housing. A recent survey found one in 5 houses is the Southern Wheatbelt is unoccupied. A lot of these vacant houses are on farms or rural



Many are vacant for a reason. They are well on their way to rack and ruin. They are not needed for the farm, or they are too far out for anyone else.

But what about the rest. Still liveable with modest investment. Not too far out. With access to power and water.

Farmers generally are not in the real estate business, but if you could rent it out to a good tenant with guarantees from the Shire or a local employer or both, and there is someone else to co-invest in any works needed, would you consider it? What would it take?

The Shire of Cuballing is investigating the possibility of a housing pilot using existing rural housing stock. A lot quicker to refresh existing housing stock than build new houses. Do you have one and what would it take for you to make it available?

We need your input, your ideas, your suggestions - and your houses.

COUNCIL COMMITTEES

AUDIT COMMITTEE - INDEPENDENT MEMBER/S

The Shire of Cuballing is seeking one or more independent members to serve on its Audit Committee. Ideally the independent member would have particular experience or expertise that would give them a sound understanding of accounting practices.

The Audit Committee meets around 2 or 3 times per year. The committee consists of the entire Council plus the independent member or members. Staff are not permitted to serve on the audit committee.

The role of the audit committee is to support Council in fulfilling its governance and oversight responsibilities in relation to financial reporting, internal control structure, risk management systems, internal and external audit functions and ethical accountability.

The audit committee should critically examine the audit and management reports provided by the external auditor. The committee would then determine if matters raised in the reports require action to be taken by the local government and ensure that appropriate action is implemented.

A further role for the audit committee would be to receive and authorise the report relating to the audit prepared by the CEO that is to be sent to the Minister. This report would outline any actions the local government has taken or intends to take in relation to the matters identified by the auditor.

CEMETERIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE – COMMUNITY MEMBERS

The Cemeteries Advisory Committee consists of 1 to 2 councillors and several members of the community (presently 4).

The role of the Committee is to advise Council on matters relating to cemeteries, lonely graves, niche facilities and the Shire of Cuballing Cemeteries Local Law 1998 generally, including but not limited to: fees and charges; maintenance quality, practices and procedures; infrastructure requirements; design elements; relevant and required Policies; community expectations and needs. It may also promote and identify opportunities for development and enhancement of cemeteries, remembrance gardens and niche facilities.

The Committee presently meets twice per year in April/May and October/November.

Interested members of the public are invited to submit an expression of interest in writing addressed to the CEO. The expression of interest should include any information you consider relevant to Council for it to decide to make the appointment. Please specify which committee you are interested in joining. Participation is voluntary and unpaid.

An Extraordinary Voting In Person Election will be held on Saturday, 16 December 2023 in the Shire of Cuballing to fill the following vacancies:

1 Councillor 4 Year Term

Nominations Open on Thursday, 26 October 2023

Nominations Close at 4:00pm Thursday, 2 November 2023

Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer: at any time during the above period by arrangement; or

between 2:00pm and 4:00pm Thursday, 2 November 2023 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Cuballing, 22 Campbell Street, CUBALLING.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission (www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 1,000 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$100 (cash, EFT, bank cheque or postal order);
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled Local Government Candidate Induction, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating (please note the reference number when you have completed the course); and
- (optional) in addition to your A4 profile, you may provide additional information that you consider
 to be relevant to your candidature. This written statement must be not more than 2,000 characters (including spaces), must be in the English language and is for publication on the local government's official website.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate. The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

DOG AND CAT RENEWALS 2023/2024

WHERE DO I RENEW OR REGISTER MY DOG/CAT?

Registrations can be completed at the Shire Office during Office hours Monday to Friday. Registration Forms can be collected from the Shire office or emailed if requested. Please remember to bring proof of sterilisation (sterilisation certificate) if sterilised and your pets microchip number. More information regarding pet registration can be found on the Shire of Cuballing Website.

Renewal Notices will be issued at the end of September and will be due on the 31st of October. Payment for the renewal of your dog/cat can be done in person, via direct debit or over the phone.

If you are a Concession Card Holder, you can receive a 50% discount on your animal's registration. Please bring your concession card into the Office when registering your dog/cat.







WHY REGISTER?

Dog owners are required by law to have all dogs over the age of 3 months microchipped and registered with Local Councils. Cat owners are also required by law to have all cats over the age of 6 months sterilised, microchipped and registered with Local Councils. Registrations for both Cats and Dogs are transferable within Western Australia.

Registration Periods are from the 1st of November to the 31st of October each year. The year of renewal will change depending on whether your Dog/Cat has been registered for 1 year, 3 years or Lifetime.

WHAT IF THE CIRCUMSTANCES CHANGE AFTER REGISTRATION?

When you move address, relocate an animal or if your animal sadly passes away, please advise us of these changes. You can contact the Shire Office over the phone on 9883 6031, via email or in person at our Office Building.

Change of animal ownership must be done in writing (either a written letter or email) and sent to the Shire.

COUNCIL SHORTS

Detailed below are some of the highlights of the September 2023 Ordinary Council Meeting.

Local Government Elections

Every 2 years half of the Council comes up for election. 2023 is an election year with voting scheduled for 21 October. Unfortunately, this year there were only 2 nominations for the 3 positions. This means that the two nominees were elected unopposed. They will take up their new terms following the scheduled election day. The Councillors elect are:

Cr Rob Harris, Deputy Shire President. This will be Rob's second term on Council. He has represented the Shire on Central Country Zone and the Regional Roads Group, and is also a board member of the Peel Harvey Catchment Council. Rob will continue for another 4 year term.

Mr Scott Ballantyne. Scott will take up his position following the scheduled date of the election, 21 October 2023. Scott has previously served two terms as a Councillor, and has been an independent member of the Audit

To fill the remining position Council has declared an extraordinary election for 16 December 2023. That means the nomination period will ne between Thursday, 26 October 2023 and 4:00pm Thursday, 2 November 2023.

The CEO has been appointed as Returning Officer If you have ever considered standing for Council now is your chance. Contact Stan for more information.

Change in Basis of Rates

Council has decided to request that the Minister for Local Government change the basis of rates for the two Feed Mills located in the Shire of Cuballing. Under the Local Government Act land used for primarily rural purposes should be rated as Unimproved Value (UV), while other properties should be rated as Gross Rental Value (GRV). Council took the view that feed mills are manufacturing and should be rated GRV. As a result of submissions from affected businesses, Council is proposing to phase in the change over 2 years,

RoadWise

The Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) has invited the Shire of Cuballing to become a RoadWise Council. The invitation said: "This new initiative has been developed to encourage, motivate and support Local Governments to incorporate best practice road safety principles and policy across their business services to reduce the number of people killed and seriously injured on local roads." Council has accepted the challenge committed to embed road safety into its operations.

River Restoration Works

Council has given its support to a request by the Peel Harvey Catchment Council to undertake river restoration works on the Hotham and Williams Rivers. The Shire has a long-standing relationship with PHCC. Previous projects have included weed control and restoration works in the section of the river near the Popanyinning townsite.

The section of river for the proposed works is a 6 kilometre section east of Pumphrey's Bridge on the boundary between the Shires of Cuballing and Pingelly.

SHIRE OF CUBALLING LOCAL PLANNING SCHEME No. 2

AMENDMENT No. 6

In accordance with the provisions of Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015, regulation 64 the Shire of Cuballing gives notice of the approval by the Minister of Amendment No. 6 to the Shire of Cuballing Local Planning Scheme no. 2.

The full details of the Amendment are available on the Shire of Cuballing website and will also be published in the WA Government Gazette.

The Amendment made the following changes:

- Replacing large sections of text with updates from the Model Provisions for Local Planning Schemes set out in Schedule 1 of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015 (Model Scheme Text).
- 2. Updating definitions to conform with definitions set out in the Model Scheme Text.
- 3. Adding the Model Scheme Text definitions, plus adding other definitions to Part 6.
- 4. Extending the Aims of the Scheme in clause 1.6 (new clause 9).
- 5. Deleting the Zoning Table and replacing with a new Zoning Table.
- 6. Inserting provisions relating to car parking and vehicle access, commercial vehicle parking, signage and advertisements, landscaping, caretaker's dwellings, workforce accommodation, servicing, general appearance of buildings and preservation of amenity, servicing, mining operations and regional facilities.
- 7. Modifying provisions relating to the Rural Townsite, Rural Residential and General Agriculture Zones.
- 8. Modifying references of 'General Agriculture' zone to 'Rural' zone.
- 9. Moving the details in Schedule Four Special Use Zones to clause 21.
- 10. Modifying Schedule A Supplementary Provisions.
- 11. Adding Schedule 1 Exempted Signage and Advertisements.
- 12. Addressing administrative anomalies.
- 13. Renumbering the scheme provisions and schedules sequentially and updating any cross referencing.
- 14. Updating the Table of Contents.
- 15. Modifying the scheme maps through changing 'General Agriculture' zone to 'Rural' zone and changing reserve names to align with Schedule 3 Legends used in Scheme from the *Planning and Development* (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015.

NATIONAL FARM CRIME SURVEY

The first attempt in more than 20 years to build an understanding of rural crime on a national scale has been launched by the University of New England (UNE)'s Centre for Rural Criminology.

The survey seeks to gain a better understanding of the climbing rate of rural crime from the perspective of farmers and landholders.

The Centre's <u>2023 Australian Farm Crime Survey</u> will ask landholders to detail their experiences of rural crime, and gather opinions about the effectiveness of crime prevention.

The national survey follows the Centre's <u>2020 New South Wales Farm Crime Survey</u>, the results of which had far-ranging impacts on policing of rural crime in the State.

Among other issues, the NSW survey highlighted farmers' frustration at their inability to monitor stock against theft. In response, UNE supported a smart tag trial that proved that following a theft, stock could be successfully tracked by police.

The Centre's co-director, Dr. Kyle Mulrooney, says in order to combat farm crime, police and policymakers need better information from those involved in farming who have key insights into the important issues.

"Increasing the capacity to fight farm crime is crucial," Dr Mulrooney says.

This survey puts the farmers' voice front and centre, allowing us to gain a better understanding of the scope of the problem, as well as find out what measures might be taken by the Government, police, farmers and rural communities to reduce farm crime across Australia.

The national survey will seek perspectives from landholders large and small, from across Australia. The information will be used to build an understanding of landholder attitudes towards current policing and justice system responses to rural crime, which may eventually inform future crime prevention measures.

As a landowner or occupier you are required under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 to carry out fire prevention work on your property. Please read this notice carefully—if there are any points that are not fully understood, please contact the Shire of Cuballing Phone (08) 9883 6031.

This work must be carried out by 31 October 2023 OR WITHIN 14 DAYS OF BECOMING THE OWNER OR OCCUPIER, SHOULD THIS BE AFTER THAT DATE and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 15 May 2024.

PERSONS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS NOTICE MAY BE ISSUED WITH AN INFRINGEMENT NOTICE OR PROSECUTED. WHERE THE OWNER FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE NOTICE, COUNCIL OR ITS DULY AUTHORISED OFFICERS WILL CARRY OUT THE REQUIRED WORK AT THE

COST OF THE OWNER.

If you do not meet your responsibilities as outlined in this brochure, you may be fined a minimum of \$250 and be required to meet the cost of Council's efforts to make you comply with this Notice. Ultimately you could be liable for a maximum penalty of \$5,000—plus costs.

SHIRE OF CUBALLING FIRE-BREAK NOTICE

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this Notice, to the satisfaction of Council or its duly authorised officers.

A FIREBREAK is a strip of land that has been cleared of all trees, bushes and grasses and any other object or thing or flammable material leaving clear earth. This includes the trimming back of all overhanging trees, bushes, shrubs and any other object or thing over the fire break area to the satisfaction of the Fire Control Officer.

RURAL LANDS

Firebreak not less than 2.5 metres wide must be established along, inside and within 20 metres of the external boundary of each property (i.e. cleared/part cleared or uncleared land) and where the boundary is adjacent to or adjoins a used gazetted road.

In the Interest of protection from soil erosion, firebreaks may be established on the land contours but only with prior approval of the Council or its duly authorised officer.

An area 4 metres wide cleared of all flammable material shall be established immediately around the perimeter of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas.

BUILDING AND HAYSTACKS:

A firebreak of at least 4 metres wide and not more than 40 metres from the perimeter of all buildings (including temporary dwellings e.g. caravans) and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks so as to completely surround the buildings, haystacks and/or fuel dumps. Any fodder being stored within 100 metres of a building must have a 20 metre break around.

BUILDOZED BUSH:

A firebreak 20 metres wide shall be maintained immediately inside the external boundaries of all land which has been buildozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether it is intended to burn the bush or not).

STATIONARY PUMPS/MOTORS:

A firebreak 4 metres wide shall be cleared and maintained around all stationery pumps and motors.

HARVESTING OPERATIONS:

During the period when harvesting operations are being conducted, there shall be provided in the same paddock or within 400 metres of that paddock an operational independent mobile fire fighting unit having a water capacity of not less than 650 litres. The tank of the unit shall be kept full of water at all times during the harvest operations. The responsibility to supply the unit being that of the land owner.

HARVEST BANS AND OTHER BANS:

Permitted activity: Loading and offloading of grain and fertiliser is only permitted on sites which have been cleared of all inflammable material save live standing trees to a radius of at least 50 metres with a laneway access similarly cleared to a minimum of 4 metres. A mobile fire fighting unit should be in attendance at all times where possible.

OPERATION OF PLANT AND MACHINERY:

During the restricted and prohibited burning times, all harvesters and trucks carting grain shall not be operated on rural land unless fitted with a fire extinguisher.

PADDOCK BURNS

At any time throughout the year, where a landowner intends to burn paddocks, the following must be provided to prevent the escape of fire:

- Firebreak 2.5 metres wide, clear of all inflammable material, completely surrounding the area to be burnt; and
- An operational fire fighting unit having a capacity of not less than 650 litres; and
- Permits to burn may be required. Contact your Fire Control Officer for details.

TOWNSITES AND RURAL RESIDENTIAL LAND

All town lots under 2,024m² (1/2 acre) in area and all fuel depots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris and flammable material to a height not more than 50mm.

Regen Ag community healthy and growing

What a time our team had in Margaret River at the 2023 Regen Ag Conference hearing from experts in RegenAg from across the state, Australia and internationally, sharing their knowledge and highlighting the opportunities that new forms of farming present to our community.

Distilling a week of field trips, lectures and networking is impossible, but there were several main threads that ran through the whole event:

- Healthy communities are essential to support Agriculture, whether they be bacterial and fungal communities, plant communities or communities of growers, sellers and customers. There is strength in diversity and support to be had from gathering likeminded communities around us.
- Rethinking how we farm should be embraced. New practices, technologies, markets and resources are increasingly available to farmers, and to

- ensure ongoing access to markets, good prices and sustainable businesses, embracing new ways of thinking will be essential.
- Food ain't food. Nutrient density, knowing where food is produced, understanding the carbon footprint of produce and whether a product is organic, carbon-neutral or biodynamic are all important to the consumer and emerging markets.
- Changing practice is hard but worth it. Learn from others, start small and make mistakes, surround yourself with others who are also changing and don't hesitate to try new things if they make sense to you. Science doesn't know all the answers – it might have to catch up later.

There is so much more to do to support mainstream adoption of regenerative agricultural practices, but the sector is increasingly understanding the benefits to production and our farming landscapes. For landholders wanting to make a transition away from traditional agriculture there is a lot of support, which will help mitigate some of the risks in transition.

PHCC is excited to have been able to make more networks and connections with farmers, suppliers and groups in the Regen Ag space last week, and we are looking forward to continuing to support farmers in our region undertake productive, sustainable food and fiber production in a landscape that supports a diversity of life and livelihoods in the future.

Landcare matters

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update



Seedlings for the Williams River

Two planting efforts in the past month have put 1000 seedlings in the ground near the Albany Highway Bridge on the Williams River in Williams. Thanks must go to the Wildlife Warriors (and trusty parent helpers), and the Williams Environmental Group for their hard work in making it happen.

This is the 'first pass' planting at the River Action Plan site, which is one of eight in the Hotham-Williams sub-catchment. Just two species were chosen at this early stage, Juneus subsecundus and Melaleuca rhaphiophylla. Both of them are local to the area and salt tolerant, which is necessary due to the high salinity levels in the river. J. subsecundus is a sedge, which is a grasslike perennial herb that is growing beautifully upstream of the planting site. We hope it will do the same in the newly planted area, although the ground immediately next to the bridge is extremely compacted and the holes were very difficult to dig! The sedge is relatively low-growing and will still provide a view of the river for visitors to the spot, which is popular for travelers. M. rhophiophylla is also growing happily nearby and these were planted amongst the sedges to (eventually) give much-needed shade to the banks and the river itself. The seedlings are currently very small tube stock size, which survive better than more mature seedlings when planted in-situ.

Revegetation is a tricky business! It is not uncommon to lose half the seedlings in the first summer, and it really is a case of adding more every year to ensure a net increase in vegetation over time. It will help if spring brings us a few rain events so that the ground doesn't dry out too quickly, and there is the added complication of the compacted ground we mentioned!

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
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
