





ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING

Patmore feeds Boundary Adjustments

Council considered a request from Patmore Feeds through the WA Planning Commission to realign lot boundaries around the feed mill. The proposed would mean the feed mill will be on its own dedicated lot, and the adjacent residence would be combined with adjacent agricultural land. The proposed changes do not increase the number of lots, but will consolidate the farmland into 3 similar sized parcels. Council supported the application.



NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



What do straight lines and squares have to do with river restoration?

The Oxford Dictionary defines monitoring as observing or checking the progress or quality of something over a period of time. In the case of restoration projects, this involves a number of methods that allow us to measure the changes we are making in degraded natural areas.

A regular method of monitoring used at our project sites is the installation of transects, which are straight lines of a set length in a specific location, along which standardised observations and measurements are made. Once established, monitoring sites are revisited annually to measure change over time.

Transects were established last year at the Pumphreys Bridge, Williams and Quindanning River Action Plan sites within riverine vegetation where weed control and revegetation are already occurring. The standardised observations included in each

monitoring effort were fauna activity, groundcover/mid-storey/canopy species, canopy cover, and species richness within square quadrats attached to the transect. Permanent photo monitoring points are also included in the transect to provide an additional visual indication of change.

River Health Assessments were carried out during the development of the Hotham-Williams River Action Plan in 2019-2020. These included detailed water quality testing which can be repeated at a future date to also measure changes in parameters such as nutrients, turbidity, temperature, oxygen, salinity and presence/absence of aquatic fauna species.

A drone was recently used as an additional monitoring tool at the Williams and Pumphreys Bridge sites. Once again, the focus was on the main areas of current and

intended activities. This gives us a fresh perspective of the sites, watch this space for some drone images!

This project is funded through partnerships with both South32 Worsley Alumina and Newmont Australia (Boddington).

Landcare matters

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update



Talkin' regenerative land & livestock with Bruce Maynard

Renowned regenerative agriculturalist and 2022 National Bob Hawke Landcare Award winner Bruce Maynard from near Bowden NSW visited Wandering on Tuesday 24th October to speak to a keen crowd of 30 people about techniques for managing land and livestock for more regenerative outcomes. But what does that even mean?

Bruce explained how some land management practices that were 'softer' on the land, like his 'no-kill' method of sewing crops into pasture or cover-crops which reduces soil disturbance and erosion while also supporting soil health. He also explained the benefits of providing support for soil-driven nutrient cycling which over time becomes less dependent on synthetic inputs.

The group, who came from the local district as well as further afield in Perth, also got to hear about Bruce's tips on managing livestock in rotational programs through a better understanding of their behaviour, as well as using their grazing patterns to better understand the land capacity at any given time. Using a hands on approach Bruce demonstrated some livestock management principles and the impact changing animal behaviour can have of production, paddock health and a farmer's time.

There was a lot of discussion on how changing traditional land practices can lead to challenges with pests, cash-flow and paddock/fencing management; but with Bruce's inclusive and inquisitive communication it was evident that taking a no-judgement approach and respecting the unique situations each farmer faces on their land is a key aspect of his regenerative

farming methods. As well as the importance of maintaining profitable enterprises!

Following some refreshments everyone headed out to one of the Watts' farms north of Wandering and had wide ranging discussions on regenerative farming practices in the district and what threats and opportunities there could be along the way.

Bruce was lucky to get away given all the questions he had, but it just shows there is lots of interest in the Hotham-Williams district for information on regenerative agricultural practices, however it is done and whatever other name it might have - let's just call it farming for the future!



Pingelly-Cuballing line upgrade starting soon

A \$3 million package of work in the Shires of Pingelly and Cuballing to improve power reliability and the safety of the network to re-commence in November. The total work includes replacement of 230 poles, 27km of overhead lines, along with other essential network maintenance activities. This will be focussed on the main line between Cuballing and Popanyinning.



85% of total poles and 30% of lines were replaced in March, April earlier this year. Stage two work is planned from mid November to mid December 2023. This upgrade will help strengthen network resilience against seasonal and environmental impacts and enhancing safety.

Timeframe

Stage 1: March to April 2023 (completed). Stage 2: Mid November to mid December 2023.

Planned outages

It's important to know that we need to schedule power outages to do the work safely. To minimise the impact on the community, we're deploying a temporary large-scale generator to support homes and businesses in the area as we complete this essential work.

Residents of Pingelly, East Pingelly, West Pingelly, Brookton, Popanyinning, Yornarning, and Cuballing may receive some short outages, one in the morning and one in the evening (up to 30 minutes) while the generator is connected and disconnected.

A small number of customers may experience longer outages when work is happening on their part of the network. Affected customers will be directly notified about outage dates and times.

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

Lung cancer is the third most common cancer affecting both women and men in Western Australia

In 2019, 693 Western Australian men and 564 Western Australian women were diagnosed with lung cancer.

Common symptoms of lung cancer include:

Coughing or spitting up blood (once or more)

Or, for more than four weeks:


- A new cough or change to your usual cough
- A lot of chest infections
- Finding it hard to breathe
- Losing weight without trying
- Not feeling hungry
- Pain in your chest and/or shoulder
- Feeling tired or lacking energy
- · Changes to your voice, such as hoarseness or croaky voice

If you have coughed up blood, even if it was just once, it's important to tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away.

If you have had any of the other symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or health worker. It doesn't mean you've got lung cancer – often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get checked out to be safe.

If it is lung cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

The garden has been given divided attention, the bulbs cut back, garden beds tidied, fertilised and mulched. It is looking tidy only in a hotch-potch fashion. Onions and garlic started to be pulled, potatoes, carrots and beetroot harvested as well as the last of the broccoli, chard, broad beans. All made ready for summer vegetables, the slow transplanting of cucumbers, pumpkin, zucchini, tomatoes and herb beds refreshed. Oranges, mandarins and still being picked ripe off the trees and straight into the mouth. The last couple of weeks mulberries also have ripened, so now I must find that pomegranate molasses recipe adapted last year to make mulberry molasses.

Inspite off this busyness I am feeling unmoored, untethered, reading has little appeal as the attention span to dive into another world cannot is lost. The only solace found is through podcasts, particularly Aria Code, listening to already played episodes and then suddenly new episodes appeared, bringing a moment of mooring me to something. This is the only recommendation I can give to those who appreciate music, it might not suit your tastes, but that is the beauty of being: we all have our opinions, likes and dislikes.

My attention seems to want to wander to places that are difficult to acknowledge. Some nights when sleep eludes, a wander into the garden is all I can hope for to dispel these feelings of unease. As I look up into the night sky or wander about this tiny piece of land, the slow and painful realisation is that I can never truly know it. I can stand stock still listening to the wind, the birds and small animals concentrating on "feeling" and opening up my mind and body to country, A warm peacefulness spreads over me taking away the little day to day superficiality. The feeling of renewal is bliss, but the land does not speak to me, I cannot feel anchored, there is something fundamental missing, then comes the slow realisation that the anchoring of ancient stories cannot be accessible. It is the land's stories that anchor everything, these will never be a part of me and my feelings of belonging are simply an artifice, diminishing me back to a coloniser's granddaughter. I cover my weeping face to hide my shame.




