- 2 Any "Request for Tender/Quote" documentation which refers to the relevant MRWA bituminous surfacing specification is to be worded accordingly, to ensure that both the Shire representative (as in 1 above) and the contractor's onsite supervisor inspect the texture of the road surface prior to commencement of any works.

Hello Wayne and Eva

Thank you for meeting with Avril and I on Wednesday to discuss the lease/freehold of Lots 24, 25, 26, 332, 331 and 330 Francis Street, Popanyinning.

I have discussed with my manager your request to include Lots 331 and 330 into the new lease and subsequently include in the amalgamation and freehold investigation. My manager has confirmed that there is no objection to this, with the proposed amalgamation and freehold being subject to Main Roads WA and Department of Planning agreement being forthcoming.

Wayne, would you please confirm that you wish to include Lots 331 and 330 into your new lease and in the amalgamation and freehold investigation? Also, please confirm the extent of the road closure area. i.e. will the road be closed to the northern boundary of Lot 330 or the northern boundary of Lot 331? If the road is closed to the northern boundary of Lot 330 then the freehold owner of Lot 323 will need to be offered portion of the closed road in line with current policy. You may wish to liaise with the owner of Lot 323 and obtain their comments and provide to this department. Should the owner of Lot 323 not be interested in any portion of the road then this will be offered to yourself.

Once the extent of the road closure has been determined, the Shire of Cuballing will then be required to undertake the road closure formalities as per the Table C and as discussed in our meeting on Wednesday.

My manager has agreed that Lot 201 remain separate and for the amalgamation of the leased area, road closure area and freehold Lots 33, 328, 35 and 36 into one composite lot to proceed.

Our department will now seek a current unimproved market rental valuation for the new lease area.

In relation to clearing the land, the lessee must obtain any authorisation required for any conduct, activity or use undertaken on the leased premises to comply with environmental law. You may wish to discuss the requirements and obligations to clear the leased premises with the Department of Environment Regulation (DER). A clearing permit may need to be obtained through DER.

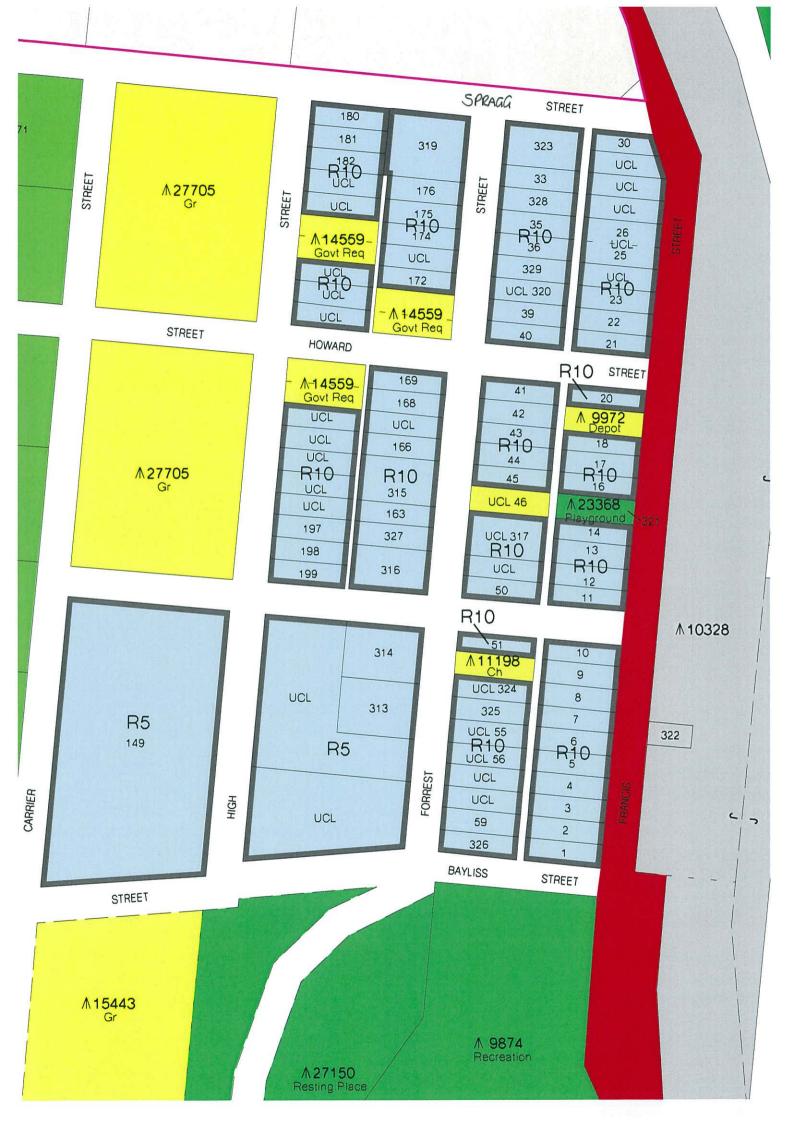
