Agenda's for each meeting are included on the Shire website by the weekend prior to each meeting. Minutes of Council Meetings are also available.


LOCAL RABBIT HAEMORRHAGIC DISEASE VIRUS (CALICIVIRUS) RELEASE

The European rabbit is a declared pest and costs the Australian agricultural industry 206 million dollars a year. Grazing pressure from feral rabbits reduces crop yields and prevents the regeneration of native bushland. They compete with native animals for food and shelter, with at least 304 Australian threatened species adversely affected by competition and land degradation. Rabbits can also cause damage by undermining the structure of homes, stables and sheds.

The Shire of Cuballing is currently working with the Peel-Harvey Catchment Council and local landowners to again release the RHDV1 K5 strain of the calicivirus as part of a Feral Rabbit Control Program.

The release will again occur following the strict guidelines to make sure the release is effective on site. The virus is spread by flies and mosquitos and can spread up to 4km from the release area.

Pet rabbits can be protected through the release period with a vaccination of the Cylap® vaccine. For full protection, your rabbit will need two vaccinations a month apart with follow up vaccinations every six months. Contact your local veterinarian to make an appointment as soon as possible to protect your pet.

CAT ACT 2011 — CAT REGISTRATION

All cats over the age of six months must be registered, sterilised and microchipped. Cats can be registered for:

- One year
- Three years
- The lifetime of the cat.

All cat registrations in the Shire of Cuballing expire on 31st October.

Cat owners can

- contact their local vets to arrange sterilisation and
- microchip their cat prior to registration.

Cat breeders or those who are planning to become breeders must apply for a cat breeding permit from the Shire of Cuballing.

When registering their cat, owners can provide proof of sterilisation with any of the following:

- Veterinary Surgeons Certificate
- Statutory declaration signed by the cat owner
- By an Officer of the Shire of Cuballing sighting an ear tattoo.

When registering their cat, owners can provide proof of microchipping with:

- A copy of the microchip certificate/paperwork; or
- Veterinary Surgeons Certificate.

Cats cannot be registered without proof of microchipping and sterilisation.

Some cats may be exempt from microchipping due to circumstances such as advanced age or other factors. In these instances proof of a microchip exemption must be provided in writing from a veterinarian.

50% of the fee is payable after 31st May for a 1 year registration expiring on 31st October.

Pensioner concession can only be applied on presentation of a current Pensioner Concession Card, State Concession Card, Veteran's Card or Senior's Card together with a Commonwealth Senior's Health Card.

Council often receives complaints about feral cats throughout the Shire. From time to time Council looks to trap feral cats and humanely dispose of them. The Shire also has cat traps available for hire to local residents and property owners.

Owners of registered cats should ensure that their cat is easily distinguishable from a feral cat by at least having a collar. Shire staff will also check any cats caught for a microchip.

YORNANING DAM PUBLIC MEETING

The Shire of Cuballing held a public meeting with neighbours and interested local residents on Tuesday 12th March 2019 about the continuation of rehabilitation projects at Yornaning Dam. The meeting discussed the Shire's funding application for funding for continued rehabilitation of native vegetation and improving the walk trails around the dam including a boardwalk section across the southern dam wall. The Shire will also seek funding for new shade shelters, picnic benches and solar lighting. A plan to further extend the walk trails in future years was also discussed.

The Yornaning Dam neighbours and interested local residents requested Council investigate possible improvements to the parking areas to assist in accessibility for people with disabilities. The meeting also discussed the possibility of Council reconsidering their current ban on camping at the Yornaning Dam.

COUNCIL SHORTS

At recent Council Meetings Council has:

- adopted their 2017/18 Annual Report. A copy of this report is available from the Shire Office or Shire website;
- renewed the employment contract of current Chief Executive Officer Gary Sherry;
- approved works of \$47,924 to rebuild the shed at the Cuballing Golf Club destroyed by fire. While the shed will be replaced by the Council insurance the Cuballing Golf are currently fund raising to replace contents of the Shed damaged or destroyed in the fire.

WANDERING NARROGIN ROAD WORKS

Shire of Cuballing Works staff are nearing completion of the road widening project on the Wandering Narrogin Road. This project has been delayed by clearing permit issues over a number of years, but with completion of this latest work the works schedule are back on track.

Vehicles using the road are requested to be mindful of traffic signage to ensure road safety for both drivers passengers and Shire works staff on the road side.

SPEEDING DRIVERS

The Shire of Cuballing has recently used the Shire's large Variable Message Board in Beeston Street in Cuballing and in Francis Street in central Popanyinning to advise drivers of their speed. The Variable Message Board is able to flash a passing vehicles speed and issue a warning if the speed exceeds the speed limit.

While the Shire doesn't have data for vehicles speeding through Popanyinning local residents have advised that the Variable Message Board does slow drivers. Before the Variable Message Board was placed in Beeston Street, only 46% of vehicles were travelling in the 50kmh speed limit with 6% of vehicles travelling at over 20kmh the speed limit.

MEN'S SHED MATTERS

Those Dryandra Village tables and benches are in need of some serious attention so we purchased a couple of random orbital sanders and detail sanders that do the job very well followed by a coat of varnish and they look great. The tables are rather wobbly so we are reinforcing them with brackets.

The steel wheel bench seats are coming along well; most of the steel supports have been shapes and are ready to be welded on; the timber needs to be de nailed and machined to size and then they are ready to (not) roll.

The veneering of the Singer treadle machine has hit a snag; with the equipment we have, we cannot put enough pressure when clamping to glue on the veneer. So we have to figure out how to set up a press to achieve the right pressure.

The ladies of the Women's Shed are venturing more and more into challenging areas of machines and tools and are doing great things indeed.

Our committee for The Cuby Festival had it first meeting and the outlines for it are getting clearer: The Cuballing Golf Club is definitely on board, we are chasing people who have old craft skills (if you are one or know of any, please let us know) for demonstrations and selling of their products, country music, line dancing (pending negotiations), a market, camp oven cooking and enjoying a great sitaround-fire.

We have committed to helping out with the Shire's Yornaning Dam stage 2; it is good to see the improvements.

We have been successful in being able to purchase a defibrillator at minimal cost thanks to the Red Cross and Lottery West; the defibrillator will be mounted to the outside of our shed where it is accessible from the road.

With all the activities going on, the meetings at smoko tend to get longer, so we have to find a way to still maintain our democratic set up and cut down on meeting time.

OUR HISTORY—BULLARRA HOTEL CUBALLING

The Cuballing Hotel was built by Mr Fitt for Edward The Cuballing Pool Hotel, as it was first named, was The licence was granted the seven-roomed, Barron in 1891. following year, with W.C. McKenzie as the first incorporating a kitchen and washhouse at the rear. licensee. His application for permission to hold the In 1896 the owner, Edward Barron, took over as licence published in the 'Australian Advertiser' of owner-licensee and ran it until he died on 4 March 28 August 1891 reads:

APPLICATION FOR A WAY SIDE HOUSE LICENSE (sic). To the worshipful the Justices of the Peace Acting in and for the district of Williams in Western Australia. I, WILLIAM CUTHBERT McKENZIE, yeoman, single, now residing at Cuballing Pool, in the district of Williams, do hereby give notice that it is my intention to apply at the next Licensing Meeting, to be holden for this district, for a Wayside House License for the sale of Liquor, in the house and appurtenances thereunto belonging, situated at Cuballing Pool aforesaid, built of galvanised iron and wood and containing three sitting rooms and three bedrooms, exclusive of those required by my family. I am the owner and occupier of the said house which is not now licensed, and which I intend to keep as an Inn or Public House. I have not held a license previously. Given under my hand this seventeenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety one.

galvanised-iron structure 1901 at the age of 70.

The licence continued in Edward Barron's name until 1903-04, Following Edward Barron the hotel was run by Mr Shannon in 1903, during whose time the name changed from Bullarra to Cuballing Hotel. There followed Edward Marted (1905), Paddy O'Rourke (1906), Edwin Savage (1907-1912) and Mrs M.E. Coombes (1912-1914) a popular licensee who later owned the Royal Hotel in Perth. Mrs M.M. Young (1914) became the first woman member of the Cuballing Branch of the Farmers and Settlers Association.

In 1905-06 a brick, single-storey building was erected to replace the original hotel which was practically demolished by a 'cockeyed bob' or cyclonic storm. This new building incorporated the original kitchen and washhouse and had three cellars set into the foundations. In 1912 a second storey was added, containing eleven bedrooms and a bathroom, and later still two showers and toilets were included. Built of local bricks, the hotel features two elaborate pediments that bear the name and date of construction.

DPIRD's Mike Clark provided information on 1080 baiting accreditation and DBCA's Peter Lacey updated us on native fauna populations in Dryandra. The results are attributable to the great feral animal control work which occurs within Dryandra and also by the landholders on their own properties.

Our numbat, woylie and other threatened species are reliant on us all working together to control feral animals. PHCC is pleased to be partnering with DBCA and Project Numbat.

TASTY BITES—HOT CROSS BUNS

INGREDIENTS

4 cups plain flour

2 x 7g sachets dried yeast

1/4 cup caster sugar

1 1/2 teaspoons mix spice

Pinch of salt

11/2 cup currants

40g butter

300ml milk

2 eggs, lightly beaten

FLOUR PASTE

1/2 cups plain flour4 to 5 tablespoons water

GLAZE

1/3 cup water2 tablespoons caster sugarButter, to serve



Method

Step 1

Combine flour, yeast, sugar, mixed spice, salt and currants in a large bowl. Melt butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Add milk. Heat for 1 minute, or until lukewarm. Add warm milk mixture and eggs to currant mixture. Use a flat-bladed knife to mix until dough almost comes together. Use clean hands to finish mixing to form a soft dough.

Step 2

Turn dough out onto a floured surface. Knead for 10 minutes, or until dough is smooth. Place into a lightly oiled bowl. Cover with plastic wrap. Set aside in a warm, draught-free place for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, or until dough doubles in size.

Step 3

Line a large baking tray with non-stick baking paper. Punch dough down to its original size. Knead for 30 seconds on a lightly floured surface until smooth. Divide into 12 even portions. Shape each portion into a ball. Place balls onto lined tray, about 1cm apart. Cover with plastic wrap. Set aside in a warm, draught-free place for 30 minutes, or until buns double in size. Preheat oven to 190°C or 170°C fan-force.

Step 4

Make flour paste: Mix flour and water together in a small bowl until smooth, adding a little more water if paste is too thick. Spoon into a small snap-lock bag. Snip off 1 corner of bag. Pipe flour paste over tops of buns to form crosses. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes, or until buns are cooked through.

Step 5

Make glaze: Place water and sugar into a small saucepan over low heat. Stir until sugar dissolves. Bring to the boil. Boil for 3-4 minutes. Brush warm glaze over warm hot cross buns. Serve warm or at room temperature.


