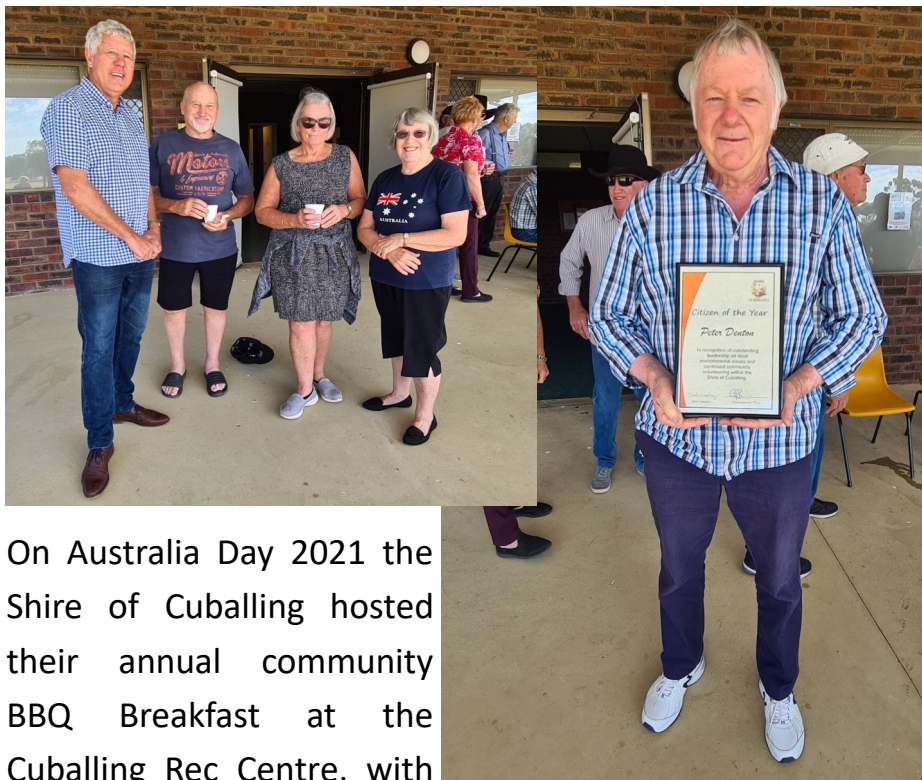

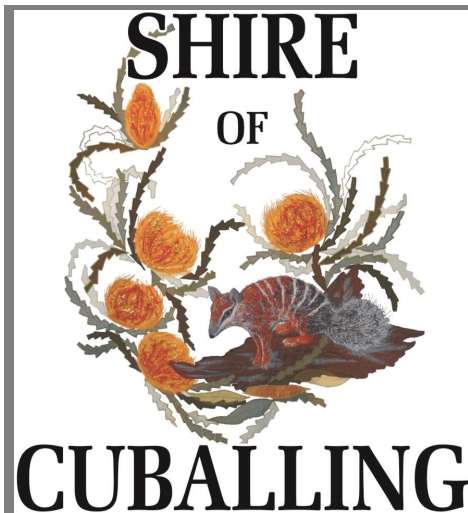

It is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 87 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005*, that the Minister for Planning approved the Shire of Cuballing Local Planning Scheme amendment on 14 December 2020 for the purpose of:

1. Rezoning Lot 7 Alton Street, Lot 9 Alton Street, Lot 8 Austral Street, Lot 91 Austral Street, Lot 92 Austral Street and Lot 90 Beeston Street from 'Rural Townsite R5' Zone to 'Rural Townsite R10' Zone and amending the Scheme Map accordingly.
2. Rezoning a portion of Lot 56 Austral Street from the 'Local Road' Reserve to the 'Rural Townsite' Zone, allocating an R-Coding of 'R5' and amending the Scheme Map accordingly.
3. Rezoning a portion of Lot 397 Beeston Street from the 'Local Road' Reserve to the 'Rural Townsite' Zone, allocating an R-Coding of 'R2.5' and amending the Scheme Map accordingly.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Black Cockatoo Surveys and Funding Assistance for Fencing

We have been busy surveying Black Cockatoo nests across the catchment to record breeding numbers this season.

Our surveys found 6 breeding pairs of Black Cockatoos across the Peel-Harvey catchment. In the Hotham-Williams sub-catchment a pair of Forest Red-tail Black Cockatoo bred in a natural hollow in Boddington. All pairs successfully produced one fledgling each.

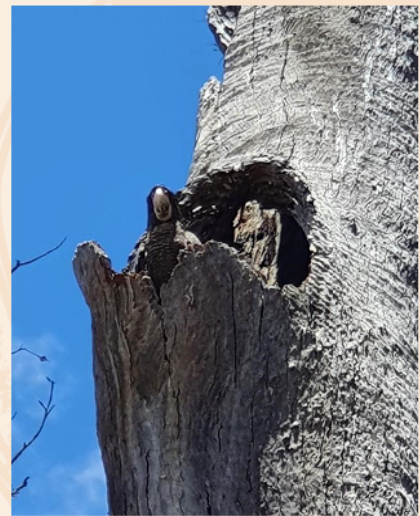
Breeding typically takes place during Spring, although Forest Red-tail Black Cockatoos have been known to breed all year round. We rely on our community to notify us - if you see any Black Cockatoos entering or exiting tree hollows or artificial nests please contact Megan at megan.leroy@peel-harvey.org.au or on 6369 8800. Megan can

confirm breeding by examining the hollow with a telescopic camera.

We are currently looking for private landholders, who have valuable Black Cockatoo habitat (food trees/shrubs & roosting/nesting trees) on their properties, that are interested in fencing to protect it. Suitable nesting trees include old or dead wandoo or marri trees with natural hollows, or food plants such as marri, jarrah, wandoo, sheoak, banksia, hakea, grevillea and jacksonia. We can provide financial assistance for the fencing costs.

If you have a fencing project in mind please get in touch.

This project is supported by PHCC through funding from the Australian Government's Environmental Restoration Fund.

Opening of Ranford (Darminning) Pool



An official opening and sign unveiling of Ranford (Darminning) Pool recently took place along the picturesque Hotham River.

With ongoing erosion issues along the riverbank and feedback from the community over a number of years, local community group, Friends of the Reserves - Boddington (Inc.), with the assistance of PHCC and Shire of Boddington, was successful with a funding application from South 32. This funding enabled the design work, approval coordination, earthworks and restoration of this popular area.

PHCC assisted with project coordination, the local Shire with earthworks coordination and Newmont Australia donated geofabric, as well as supporting the project through an existing community partnership.

Once approvals were received from all relevant agencies, work commenced with rock pitching to protect the river bank, installation of canoe access steps, a conversation pit (in consultation with our Local Noongar Elder) and designated walking areas. Planting of native vegetation was conducted by many hardworking volunteers to increase biodiversity and bring the area back to its former glory.

Today this beautiful location boasts areas for picnics, river front access and a relaxing location for families to enjoy time out while canoeing, settling in for a lazy lunch, early morning bird watching and walking.

DO YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO IN A MEDICAL EMERGENCY?

The Triple Zero (000) service is the quickest way to get the right emergency service to help you. You can contact Police, Fire or Ambulance in life threatening or emergency situations.

When you call triple zero (000) you will be asked; "Do you require Police, Fire or Ambulance?"

When you are transferred to the correct service you may be asked the following questions:
What is the address of the emergency? Street, cross reference or landmark will be required.

- What is the telephone number you are calling from? This is in case your call is terminated or further information is required.
- Tell me exactly what has happened? Provide a brief description of the problem.
- How old is s/he? If unknown then approximate age.
- Is s/he awake (conscious)? Yes or No answer required.
- Is s/he breathing? Yes or No answer required.

The Communications Officer will then ask a series of further questions more specific to the problem identified. Answering these questions will ensure the most appropriate ambulance response is provided.

The Communications Officer will give you advice over the phone to assist the patient prior to the arrival of an ambulance. They may also ask you to turn on front lights if it is dark; if possible have someone wait out the front; and make sure the door is unlocked and open so the paramedics can enter.

Please remember to try and stay calm and speak slowly to the Communications Officer. Often an ambulance will be dispatched while you are still on the phone.

The Communications Officer will be able to direct you to the nearest Defibrillator and provide you with an access code. Defibrillators in the Shire of Cuballing are located:
