PRESIDENT'S PEN

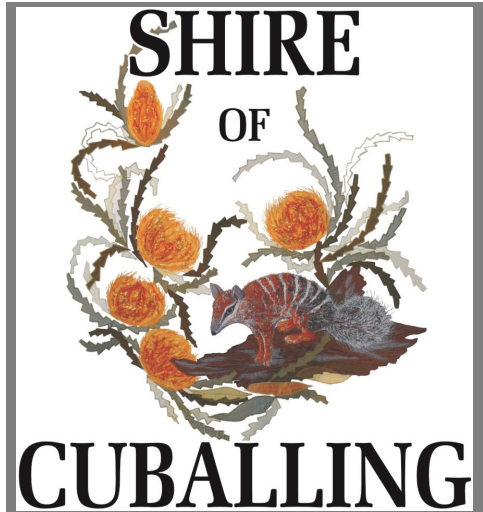
Council's budget was considered and endorsed at the recent July Ordinary Council Meeting. These are never easy decisions trying to balance service delivery with rates contribution and the long-term sustainability of the Shire of Cuballing, however for the 2021/22 financial year rates will increase by 10%.

To explain further why Council resolved such a step it is worth first noting that the Shire of Cuballing rates are the lowest, by some way, in comparison to our neighbouring Shires and even the region. That said, we should have lower rates because we don't provide the expensive services that some neighbours have, such as deep sewerage, swimming pools or libraries. We will continue to be a low rating Shire.

For our annual activities there are significant price pressures emerging particularly around materials, utilities, insurance, contractors, and staff. It coincides with a significant capital works program this year such as 4 Aged Persons Units, Popanyinning Main Street Upgrade, Cuballing East Road widening beginning with the section closest to the Cuballing townsite and our usual roadworks expenditure on Narrogin Wandering and Stratherne Roads. It is a big year by normal standards that is better summarised in the Shire Notes section of *The Cuby News*.

The Shire of Cuballing's Long-Term Financial Plan has also identified difficulties in the future years if rate increases are not maintained. Our ability to replace and renew our current assets over the long term would be comprised. Hence, Council has taken this decision to act now rather than pushing the issue onto a future generation.

STRENGTHENING TELECOMMUNICATIONS AGAINST NATURAL DISASTERS (STAND)

In response to the Black Summer fires of 2019/20, the Commonwealth government provided \$37.1m administered by the STAND (Strengthening Telecommunications Against Natural Disasters) Project, to enhance telecommunications resilience in the face of bushfire emergencies. This was subsequently enhanced to include communities affected by severe weather events such as cyclones and flooding.

STAND funding will provide fixed and portable satellite communications services and extend battery life to some of the State's mobile phone towers.

During a bushfire or cyclone, community members and stranded visitors may not have phone reception or internet access if the communications network has been damaged or power has been lost. It can be highly distressing for everyone to have no way of contacting family or friends and to have lost access to vital safety and health information resources.

What does this mean for the Shire of Cuballing

In March 2021, the Shire of Cuballing applied for funding to provide NBN fixed satellite services to our local community evacuation centres, including the Cuballing Recreation Centre and the Popanyinning Hall.

The Shire of Cuballing has been successful with both applications.

This service is designed to provide internet access and the ability to make phone calls for 40 community members concurrently using the service during emergency events. The service operates all the time in "standby" mode giving basic throttled access, and when an emergency event occurs, the service is expanded to "fully activated" for the duration of the emergency.

In the event of a loss of phone and internet service, local residents, from near the Cuballing Recreation Centre and the Popanyinning Hall, will be able to obtain mobile phone and internet services.

Across the state 41 applications from 79 Local Governments were submitted this service.

Installation dates have not been confirmed but installation is expected prior to December ahead of the coming high threat bushfire season.

2021 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

The next Shire of Cuballing Local Government Elections will be held on Saturday, 16th October 2021. Local Government Elections are held every two years on the third Saturday in October.

There are nine Councillors in the Shire of Cuballing.

Elections will be held for three of the Councillor positions in October 2021. The Shire President is elected by Councillors after the election.

Enrolment

Who is entitled to vote?

The roll for this election consists of:

1. Residents Roll

Individuals who live in the Shire of Cuballing district and are enrolled on the State Electoral Roll are automatically enrolled for the local government elections.

2. Owners and Occupiers Roll

Owners of land or nominees of corporate bodies who own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Cuballing but are not enrolled on the State Electoral Roll for the Shire of Cuballing district, may apply to be on the Owners and Occupiers Roll.

To be eligible to vote the person must be enrolled on the State or Commonwealth Government Electoral Roll where they live, and an occupier is to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument of the property within the district where they seek to vote. The right of continuous occupation must extend for a period of at least three months at the time the person claims enrolment.

When is the last day to enrol to vote in these Elections?

People who live in the Shire of Cuballing (whether they own a property or rent it) are automatically enrolled for the Shire of Cuballing Local Government Elections, if they are enrolled on the State Electoral Roll.

They must have enrolled on the State Electoral Roll by 5pm on Friday, 27 August 2021 to be eligible to vote in the 2021 Local Government Election.

Residents should direct enquiries about the State Electoral Roll to the Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC) by telephoning 13 63 06.

Non-resident individuals and companies that own or occupy property in the Shire of Cuballing may enrol up to 5pm on Friday, 27 August 2021 by completing *Form 2 - Enrolment Eligibility Claim*. Those enrolling must be on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and reside outside the Shire of Cuballing district.

What is the voting entitlement per person or property?

A person may have his or her name on the roll only once for each ward regardless of how many properties owned or occupied. A company may have a maximum of two people on the roll as nominees of that company regardless of the number of properties owned or occupied.

Voting In The Elections

The Shire of Cuballing conducts the election as a voting in person election. Council has appointed the Chief Executive Officer, Gary Sherry, as the Returning Officer for the Shire of Cuballing 2021 Elections

Council will operate polling places at

- the Shire of Cuballing administration Centre at 22 Campbell Street Cuballing; and
 - the Popanyinning Hall, 98 Francis Street Popanyinning;
- from 8am to 6pm on Election Day of Saturday 16th October 2021.

The counting of votes will be completed at the Shire of Cuballing Administration Centre at 22 Campbell Street Cuballing as soon as possible after the polling ceases.

Is voting compulsory?

No. Voting in local government elections is not compulsory in Western Australia.

Is early voting available?

Early Voting can be completed at the Shire of Cuballing Administration Centre at 22 Campbell Street Cuballing during normal business hours. This will commence as soon as possible after the close of nominations and continue until 4pm Friday 15th October 2021

Is postal voting available?

Postal Voting can be completed if electors register with the Shire of Cuballing. Contact the Shire at enquiries@cuballing.wa.gov.au or 08 9883 6031 to obtain the *Form 12 - Application for Postal Voting Papers*.

Who can nominate as a candidate?

Anyone who is on the Shire of Cuballing Electoral Roll as a resident, or an owner or occupier of rateable property within the Shire of Cuballing (and is not disqualified) can be a candidate.

Nominees of a body corporate cannot stand for election to Council.

Interested people are welcome to collect a Nomination Pack from the Shire of Cuballing. This pack includes information and the required forms to nominate as a candidate.

Rates and Charges

- The 2021/22 Budget has a 10% increase to property rates. This increase is an average across the whole of the Shire of Cuballing and follows a Nil increase from 2020/21 due to COVID.
- Individual property rates will fluctuate depending on property valuation changes.
- A rate increase was required for Council to be able to maintain services to an acceptable level with reductions to operating grants income plus increases to expenses including insurance, utilities, wages and compliance costs.
- Fees and charges have been reviewed and have incurred a 5% increase.
- Council believes that these decisions will ensure the long term financial sustainability of the Shire of Cuballing
- Unimproved/Rural properties will be rated at 0.006846

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Numbats in the Boddington Neighbourhood

A 'Numbats in the Boddington Neighbourhood' event was held in Boddington on the 22nd of July, with 45 attendees hearing from a range of guest speakers informing the community about the discovery of a numbat near Boddington.

Dr Tony Friend has been working with numbats since 1981 and spoke about numbat biology, population distribution past and present, their threats and that the numbat captured on the monitoring camera has most likely dispersed from Dryandra Woodland. Paul Bullock (South32 Worsley Alumina) gave an overview of how the numbat was discovered and what South32 are doing to protect it including monitoring, protecting habitat and feral animal control.

Christine Townsend (PHCC) spoke about the Numbat Neighbourhood Project and how with seeing this

numbat she can now work with the Boddington Community to support landholders with feral animal control and raise awareness through this workshop and a Numbat Incursion with the Boddington District High School.

Dr Judy Dunlop is the inaugural Executive Officer for the WA Feral Cat Working Group, she discussed the impacts that cats have on threatened species, including the fact that 27 of the 34 mammal extinctions in Australia are linked to predation by feral cats. Judy also discussed the methods for controlling feral cats including new technology such as the Felixer.

Josh Potts, the Shire of Boddington Ranger discussed the additional work he's been doing to control feral cats around Boddington after the sighting of the numbat. He also discussed how cat owners

need to have their cats sterilised, microchipped and registered.

Thank you to our guest speakers and to the community of Boddington for helping us raise numbat awareness.

Tunbridge Gully 2021 Planting

Another great planting season has been completed at Tunbridge Gully in Boddington!

A total of 3,300 seedlings were planted by over 70 volunteers rolling up their sleeves enjoying the muddy terrain and sunshine. A huge thankyou to the Boddington District High School, South32 Worsley Alumina, Newmont Australia, Friends of the Reserves – Boddington (Inc.), Shire of Boddington and PHCC staff and volunteers. There were smiles all round to finish the day with a scrumptious BBQ catered for by the Boddington P&C.

It was a great delight by all to see the growth of previous plantings, with some species standing taller

than many of our volunteers. As the tree species gain height they are starting to shadow the understorey and the Spiny rush (*Juncus acutus*) has continued to decline, thus improving the health of the waterway.

This year, a total of 14 different species were planted in Tunbridge Gully; *Callistemon phoeniceus*, *Casuarina obesa*, *Eucalyptus patens* & *E. rudis*, *Ficinia nodosa*, *Hakea undulata* & *H. varia*, *Juncus subsecundus*, *Kunzea recurva*, *Melaleuca incana*, *M. lateritia*, *M raphiophylla*, *M. teretifolia* & *M. viminea*.

Growing Australian Native Plants in pots

Containers and preparation.

***Pots/containers** can be of plastic, metal or clay, the clay pots should be sealed with a waterproof compound such as bondcrete [water based] so as to lessen drying out in summer months. All pots should be well drained and ideally from 175mm upwards in size, 200mm to 300mm pots probably would be most suited. Smaller pots such as 140-150mm can be used in the shorter term; once becoming pot bound can then be transferred to a larger container or planted out into the garden.

***Preparation;** place approximately 25-35mm in depth of bluemetal/gravel into the container, cover with a film of shadecloth or filter cloth to prevent soil from silting up drain holes, this is important. Very important also, is to use a genuine Australian Native Plant potting mix as a potting medium, some other potting mixes can be too high in organics and nutrients and not drain as well.

***Fertilisers;** as native plants are very efficient in utilising nutrients from the soil, the addition of synthetic/chemical fertilisers and strong organic fertilisers may be detriment to the health of the native plants. Regular watering of a liquid seaweed based fertiliser or similar is ideal. A slow release native fertiliser [6-9 month release] can be used sparingly.

***Watering;** do not over water! Keep moist in the summer and spring months allow winter rains to work, but keep watch, pots can dry out in winter as well!

*Australian native plants for pot growing

Austromyrtis dulcis Midyim berry. Small shrub, white sweet edible berries

Pimelea ferruginea. Rice flower, small rounded shrub, pink flowers in spring

Lechenaulta biloba. Small shrub, blue to pale blue flowers spring/winter

Lechenaulta formosa. Small prostrate shrub, orange, red flowers winter

Orthrosanthus multilflorus [morning iris] clumping leaf plant, blue flowers.

Pattersonia occidentalis Flag iris. Purple flowers, clumping leaf plant, 20cm

Thriptomene saxicola Pink thriptomene, small pink flowers winter. Prune.

Conostylus candicans. Yellow cottonheads. Clumping grey foliage.

Brachyscome multifida. Neat small plant, mauve yellow daisy like flowers

Correa Dusky bells. Small shrub, deep red tube flowers winter.

Correa pulchella Orange flowers in winter.

Alyogine wrayae. Dwarf hibiscus purple flowers summer. Prune to shape

Verticordia plumosa Pink flowers spring can prune hard.
