Yornaning Dam Phase 3 completion

The Shire of Cuballing has recently completed Phase 3 of the Yornaning Dam Rehabilitation Project.

The Yornaning Dam Rehabilitation Phase 3 kicked into gear Sunday 16th August 2020 with tree planting, walk trail clearing and bulrush planting since then the project had come to a halt due to covid-19. The ship that was importing the products to finish the south end boardwalk was turned around due to a crew member displaying COVID-19 symptoms! What started out as a 2 month delay turned into a 6 month delay. Just as the ship set sail with the product the rains came! Water logged the area and made it impossible for the team from Cuballing Building Company or the Shire of Cuballing to access.

We can now report the Boardwalk is finally finished and looking fantastic, ready for those lovely spring days. The wildflowers are also in full bloom. Make sure you take a water bottle, hat and mosquito spray.

The Shire of Cuballing would like to recognise the State Natural Resource Management. With out this grant program, project such as the Yornaning Dam Rehabilitation Project would not be possible.

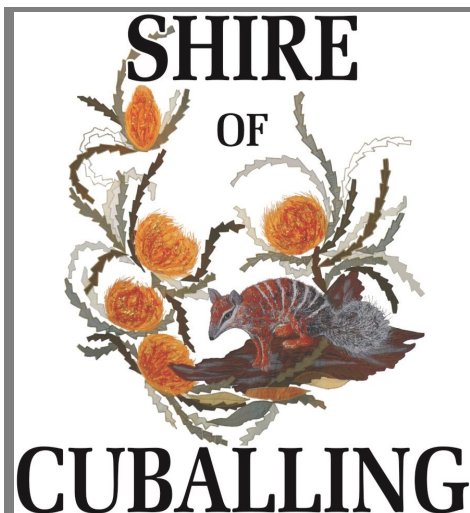

FIREBREAK REQUIREMENTS

TOWNSITES AND RURAL RESIDENTIAL LAND

All town lots under 2,024m² (1/2 acre) in area and all fuel depots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris and flammable material to a height not more than 50mm.

All lots or combination of lots that comprise of one holding and having an area of 2,024m² (1/2 acre) or greater shall be either clear of all inflammable material or have a firebreak 2.5 metres wide free of all inflammable material provided inside and along all external boundaries.

RURAL LANDS

Firebreak not less than 2.5 metres wide must be established along, inside and within 20 metres of the external boundary of each property (i.e. cleared/part cleared or uncleared land) and where the boundary is adjacent to or adjoins a used gazetted road.

In the interest of protection from soil erosion, firebreaks may be established on the land contours but only with prior approval of the Council or its duly authorised officer.

An area 4 metres wide cleared of all flammable material shall be established immediately around the perimeter of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas.

ALL PROPERTIES WILL BE INSPECTED FROM 1 NOVEMBER 2021 TO ENSURE THEY COMPLY WITH COUNCIL'S FIREBREAK REQUIREMENTS

Selection Criteria

A MAGNIFICENT LILLY;

THE GYMEA LILLY/SYDNEY LILLY [*Doryanthes excelsa*]

A native plant to the Sydney region radiating for a 100kms from Sydney proper, this spectacular plant is one of the world's largest lillies. With large sword like leaves up to 1.5m long this clumping plant sends a flowering spike up to 3metres in the air with a large red flowering head up to 350mm wide. Favoured by nectar feeding birds, insects and small bats the gyMEA lilly is a fine statement plant for the garden. Frost will burn the flowers, although I have one growing in the garden at Cuballing which is at the moment in full flower. Albeit it has taken 26 years for it to flower from a small seedling!

The plant has a lesser known relative; *Doryanthes palmerii*, which has a branching flower head. The lilly prefers alkaline soil as in the Sydney region but has proven to be quite adaptable.

Landcare matters

Hotham-Williams sub-catchment update

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



Hotham-Williams Catchment Tour for new Program Manager, Land Conservation

PHCC's new Program Manager, Land Conservation, Karen Bettink was shown around the Hotham-Williams Catchment in October by Christine Townsend and Kristy Gregory. It was a great way of giving Karen a snapshot of the projects and sites that are coordinated and managed by the PHCC Hotham-Williams team.

The day involved visiting some of our Numbat Neighbourhood and proposed River Restoration projects, as well as a landholder site visit.

Site visits are an invaluable part of our work here at PHCC. Project officers can see the sites at different times of the year, conduct photo monitoring, and check on recent project activities.

Karen will be supporting Mel Durack by overseeing PHCC's Land Conservation projects including the Numbat Neighbourhood and Black Cockatoo projects as well as several projects on the Swan Coastal Plain.

Karen has brought with her a wealth of native fauna knowledge, so there was also a stop-off during the catchment tour to look for Rakali tracks, and elusive chocolate bats!

Ephemeral Wetlands – Worth Protecting

With our regions solid rainfall this year has come the opportunity for landowners to identify areas on their land which are prone to inundation, some of which are a little surprising. Shallow depressions like this one some 100m from the Hotham River in Crossman, are not usually this wet, but this year have provided a superb habitat for an abundance of frogs and aquatic invertebrates!

Although often small, ephemeral (short-lived) wetlands like this play an important role in supporting biodiversity and nearby agricultural systems. Many aquatic bugs provide food for insectivorous birds and predatory insects (e.g. wasps) which in turn provide a valuable service towards controlling agricultural pests in crops and on farm animals.

Wetland frogs provide food for heron's, reptiles and many raptors, which all have their place in the landscape's ecosystem. Frogs are commonly referred to as 'Ecosystem Indicators', meaning if you have lots of frogs (and invertebrates) in your wetland, the ecosystem is healthy, more resilient to stress (like extreme temperatures) and likely to benefit agricultural production on adjacent land.

So as the weather warms up and the frogs start to make their noise in the evenings, consider the role these short-lived wetlands play in our catchment and enjoy the sound of the frogs, it won't be long until they, like these small wetlands, dry up.

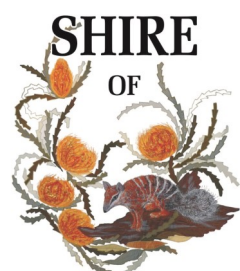

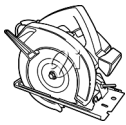
