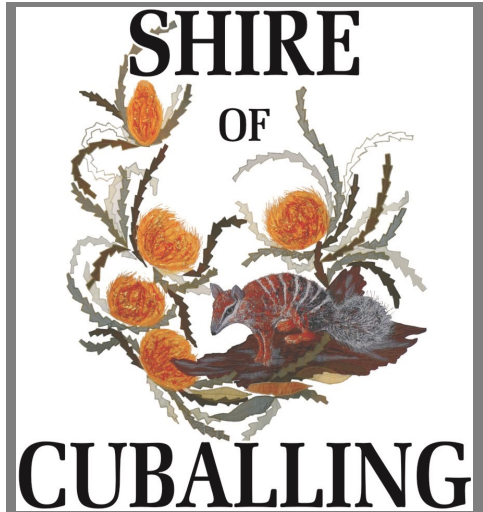
## PRESIDENT'S PEN MAY 2023

More than 40 people saw dawn rise over the Popanyinning War Memorial, a beautiful service coordinated by the Popanyinning Progress Association. An hour later, over 70 Cuballing residents commemorated ANZAC day at the Cuballing War Memorial, the upgrades to which looked very much in keeping with the day. Thanks to Rhys Chatillon for officiating the service, to Emily Ballantyne for her exceptional bugle playing and the Cuballing Tavern for putting on the scones and morning tea.

Our community events show the heart of Cuballing – they give us an opportunity to meet our neighbours, old and new, and celebrate what it means to live and work in our unique part of the world. # COUNCIL SHORTS

## Annual Budget Review

Council considered the review of the Annual Budget. There has been a substantial increase in the funding allocation for the work on the Cuballing East Road under the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network Program. Work on this project is all but completed and the funding boost was welcome.

Funding under the Commonwealth Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program has been delayed with Phase 4 now available for the next 2 financial years. The final deadline for completing Phase 3 projects has also been extended until 30 June 2024.

## Fire Control Officers

Council received the Minutes of Bushfires Advisory Committee and has endorsed the committee's recommendations. Anthony Mort has been reappointed as Chief Bushfire Control Officer for another year and Brayden Potts has been appointed as Deputy Chief for the first time. It is good to see some new faces joining the ranks of Fire Control Officers.

## Annual Report

The audited financial statements for 2021-22 have now been received. This means that Council can adopt its Annual Report at the May 2023 Council Meeting. It is likely that the annual meeting of electors will be held at 6.00pm on the 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023.

## 2023 Council Elections

A further reminder that Local Government Elections will be held on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2023. There is one vacant position following the resignation of Cr Dowdell earlier this year and two Councillors completing their terms. There will be extensive advertising in the lead up to the polls, but if anyone is interested in finding out more please talk to the CEO. If you are thinking about it you may wish to come along to one or two Council meetings to see how they work. Council meetings are open to the public.

## Independent Living Units

The Cuballing Independent Living Units are nearing completion, and final handover is expected in June this year. Council has set the rents to be charged at \$350 per unit, with the capacity for the rent to be reduced to \$300 per week in the case of hardship. If you or a family member is interested in taking up one of the units please contact the CEO. Units are still available. All other things being equal, the first to apply will get the units.

## Strategic Community Plan

Following extensive Community consultation Council will soon be considering a draft Strategic Community Plan. The plan will break with tradition by having a really succinct plan supported by a companion document with background information, statistics and specific actions arising from the strategy. Look out for the final consultation prior to adoption.
