


- To actively promote and showcase our communities as great places to stop, stay, experience and reside, especially through vibrant and welcoming town centres;

#### **COUNCIL SHORTS**



#### New Firebreak orders

At its May Council meeting Council adopted a new Firebreak Order. While very similar to previous order there is a new and important provision. Property Owners with blocks over 2024 square metres in Townsites or on Rural Residential land will be required to clear flammable material **AND** install a firebreak break. A firebreak should allow access by a fire truck and includes clearing to a height of 4 metres above the fire break.



#### **Community Meeting**

At the Community Meeting in February firebreaks and overgrown blocks were some of the issues raised. Some of the others were:

#### **Enforcement of Firebreak Orders:**

The Shire of Cuballing will be contracting the Shire of Narrogin Rangers to assist with education and enforcement. If you own property, you should be aware that, if you fail to comply with your fire break obligations the Shire can and will engage contractors to complete the work and send you the bill.

#### **Harassment of Fire Fighters**

The Shire has, with the support of Narrogin Police, obtained a Misconduct Restraining Order to prevent a particular individual from harassing or interfering with Fire Brigade Members undertaking brigade duties. This includes meetings, training and of course firefighting. The order will be in force for the next 3 years.

#### Fire Mitigation

The Shire has applied for \$150,000 to fund additional fire mitigation activities on public land controlled by the Shire. We have also consulted with DFES to ensure that Unallocated Crown land and unmanaged reserves are also maintained and made fire safe.

#### Police Presence

Community members will have noticed an increased police presence and a commitment to respond. You may be aware of a car that was impounded for hooning, and you may also have had your turn to blow in the bag. Police leadership continue to liaise closely with the Shire. Remember – if you see something say something.

#### **COUNCIL SHORTS**

Every year Council holds its May Council Meeting in Popanyinning. Council again had a busy day with a lot to work through.

#### **Financials**

As always Council considered the year-to-date financial position and the payments made during the previous month.

#### Risk Management

Senior staff have been busy working through a range of issues since we completed our Financial Management Review in February. While we have always been conscious of risk, our risk management framework had not been reviewed for some time.

Council worked through the documents and adopted updated:

- Risk Management Policy
- Risk Management Strategy
- IT Disaster Recovery Plan.

#### **Crisp Wireless**

Council approved a new telecommunications antenna for Crisp Wireless in Schoolars Road.

#### Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCIP)

LRCIP is a capital grants program allocated to Local Governments based on the Grants Commission formula. Phase 4 is the final allocation under the program and must be expended by 30 June 2025. Council selected the following projects for funding:

- A footpath and bridal trail linking the recreation centre, equestrian centre and Alton Street \$50,000.
- Reconstruction of Darcy Street between the Rail Crossing and Austral Street to improve road safety \$200,000.
- Kitchen Replacement in the Cuballing Agricultural Hall \$60,000. And
- Playground and related facilities at the Popanyinning Recreation Centre (relocating McGarrigal Park) \$80,000.

collocating McGarrigal Park Facilities with other recreation facilities will allow the site at 106-108 Francis Street to be designated as the site for a new Fire Station for Popanyinning.

#### Firebreak Order and Fire Control Officers

Council has adopted a new firebreak order. The new order gives effect to the undertaking at the community meeting that property owners will be required to install a firebreak **and** reduce fuel loads. Narrogin Rangers will be engaged to assist with education and enforcement.

Council also formalised appointment of Fire Control Officers for 2024-25.

#### Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC)

Council endorsed the recommendation from the LEMC to enter into joint arrangements with the Shire of Narrogin to improve efficiency and better engage with State agencies. Wickepin has resolved to form its own separate LEMC.

#### Chief Executive Officer

Following the CEO's decision to retire in September the Shire has contracted Lo-Go Appointments to assist with the recruitment of a new CEO.

The CEO's annual performance and salary review was finalised in accordance with contract and legislative requirements.

#### HAVE YOU EVER THOUGHT OF BECOMING A JP?

The President of the Royal Association of Justices has written to rural Shires highlighting a shortage of JPs, particularly younger JPs in rural areas. This is an unpaid voluntary position.

To become a Justice of the Peace (JP):

- Nominations must be submitted through a State Member of Parliament. In regional areas, nominations can be submitted through the local magistrate or State Member of Parliament.
- Appointees must complete a JP training course before appointment. Important information on the mandatory training course is available on the Pre- Appointment Training information below.

An applicant must satisfy the following criteria for appointment:

- Australian citizen with a minimum of 12 months residence in Western Australia.
- Enrolled on the State electoral roll.
- Of good character and reputation, including (preferably) a record of community service.
- Demonstrate a willingness and capacity to fulfil all the duties of a JP when called upon.
- Not insolvent under administration.

The Primary responsibilities of a JP include:

- Witnessing Documents and Administering Oaths and Affirmations
- Approving Search Warrants
- Bail and Surety Applications

There are approximately 2,500 Justices of the Peace (JPs) of varied nationalities and cultural backgrounds, living in all parts of WA, who provide an invaluable and voluntary services to the WA community.

JPs are appointed by the Governor who authorises them to carry out a range of official administrative duties in the community. These administrative duties include issuing search warrants, witnessing affidavits, statutory declarations and certifying documents.

NRM is the management of natural resources such as land, water, soils, plants and animals. It brings together land use planning, water management, biodiversity conservation and sustainability of industries such as agriculture, mining, tourism, fisheries and forestry.



#### Hot in the Shade

A recent visit to the River Action Plan site on the Williams River in Quindanning highlighted the importance of shade along our rivers

'Grandmother' paperbarks of a size you don't often see were providing gorgeous, lush shade under which the temperature was markedly cooler; check out the photos. The needles (leaves) and bark that had dropped on the ground also provided resilience to weed germination, which often peaks during times of stress when native plants are struggling. The cooler temperature means that pools are protected from evaporation and can provide important areas of refuge, particularly in the current alarmingly dry conditions.

In contrast was the open, sunny, and exposed area at the same site a mere 200m away. The vegetation there was under incredible stress, and last year we started planting paperbarks to eventually provide shady trees in that patch. The seedlings were still hanging on for dear life, but it will be a number of years before they are big enough to have an impact.

The moral of the story is, keep the shade you have and plant more! The ecosystem services provided by native vegetation free of charge is beyond any economic value we can attribute to it.

Hotham and Williams Rivers projects in the upper catchment are funded through partnerships with both South32 Worsley Alumina and Newmont Australia (Boddington)



#### **CUBY WOMEN'S SHED**

Hi, my name is Giri Sequoya. You have seen my name as the Secretary of the Women's Shed. I would like to introduce myself.


I was 5 or 6 years old when my favourite aunt committed suicide. She was pregnant twice and both times lost her babies due to the violence she suffered in the hands of her husband. As a child I was devastated. I went to a friend who is two years older and the two of us made a promise. We would embrace non violence and fight for equality of all, empowering women and help the underdogs.

I grew up to learn about the legal rights of women and in a country like India, it was an uphill battle. True to my promise, I became an activist, empowering women. I organised a peaceful protest in a small village to stop liquor trucks from entering the village. It took us nearly 7 weeks to get the message that the liquor trucks are not welcome. Slowly the movement gathered momentum and more and more women were able to rid their villages of alcohol and alcohol related mayhem. This helped the women gain self confidence and the men began to respect them and treat them as equals. Believe me, no easy feat in India.

Being a single mum, having divorced my then abusive husband, I focused on finding a way to better my children's future. I migrated to Australia and married a Caucasian man, thinking in my naivete that white men were more supportive of their women. I felt I could settle down. Boy, was I wrong! My husband was everything I rebelled against! So following another divorce, I was once again a single mum. Thanks to Centrelink, I was able to provide for myself and my children. I was very frugal and managed to feed and educate my children. I also realised, domestic violence was rife in this western society as well. I became a volunteer and went into prisons helping both male and female inmates embrace a nonviolent lifestyle. This work took me to many countries around the world. I also set up co-ops in 11 countries in Africa, with the main focus of empowering women.

My children are grown up and well settled in life! Then I met Carry from Cuby! What a blessing! He resonates my values and supports me in my mission. Hence I moved to Cuby. Carry and his friend John Buise, both from Cuby had started the Women's Shed. I am neither a woodworker nor a metalworker, nevertheless I joined the Shed as I am good with promotion work. I soon became the Secretary of the Women's Shed and brought business for us. We opened a dedicated bank account and we have found ways of fundraising.

Above is just the tip of the iceberg! I invite other members of the community to write something about yourselves, so we can meet the locals of this amazing community.
