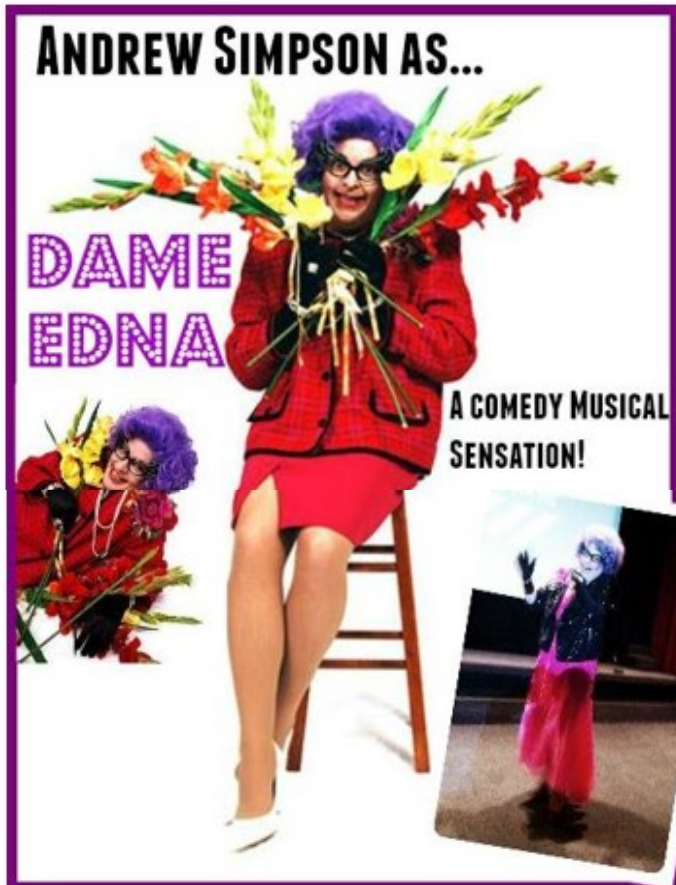

RABBIT CONTROL

For the past 3 weeks the Shire of Cuballing have been feeding the rabbits around the Cuballing townsite in the lead up to release RHDV1 K5 Rabbit Virus.

Many of you would have noticed the large increase of rabbits within the Shire, not even the Shire administration lawn is safe from the critters and most home owners have resorted to fencing their gardens and veggie patches to keep them out.

Key points

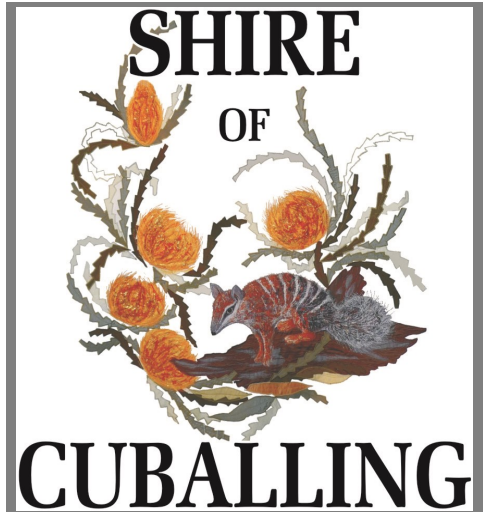
- Pre-feeding is incredibly important as it increases the uptake of the virus.,
- Rabbits need to eat the oats from the target site at least 3 times prior to the release,
- The virus is not harmful to species other than rabbits but it reduces the uptake for rabbits and decreases the effectiveness of the release.

Please note: The RHDV1-K5 is not a silver bullet in rabbit control and will not kill all rabbits. While the virus can be effective at reducing numbers at a site, that reduction will be short lived without follow up control, eg warren destruction, exclusion fencing, baiting or trapping. Rabbits that survive the release need to be controlled to prevent the further development of immunity throughout the feral rabbit population.

COUNCIL SHORTS

All the action from the March Council Meeting

Council had a busy day on 20th March. Council had an Audit Committee Meeting followed by its Regular Council Meeting and Council Forum, followed by its Annual General Meeting of Electors.

Audit Committee

At least once every 3 financial years all Local Governments are required to complete a review as set out in Regulation 17 of the Local Government (Audit) regulations. This review examines risk management, internal controls and legislative compliance. The Audit Committee received the report and recommendations.

Every year every Shire completes a Compliance Audit Return where the Shire self-assesses based on a series of compliance questions. That review has been completed for another year.

Both of these reports were also considered by Council.

Financials

As always Council considered the year to date financial position and the payments made during the previous month.

Budget Review

In the past Shires have been required to undertake a budget review before the end of March and present at the next Council meeting. This year for the first time the review deadline was brought forward by a month.

The most significant change was prompted by the delay in the funding for the Cuballing East Road. This meant that more time could be spent on maintenance. It was something of a challenge to adjust the budget to account for a reduction in funding of over \$1 million. The net outcome was no change in our closing position.

Financial Management Review

In addition to the Regulation 17 Review (see Audit Committee) the CEO is required to undertake a review of financial management systems and processes. These two reviews were combined into a single review process. The review found that systems were largely appropriate and generally effective. As a result of both reviews there will be a substantial review of Council Policies.

Planning Matters

Council approved two separate applications for outbuildings on Rural Residential properties that involved discretion in relation to some areas of the Outbuildings Local Planning Policy.

2023 Annual Report & Annual Electors Meeting

Council held its annual meeting of Electors to adopt the 2023 Annual Report. This included another unqualified audit report endorsed by the Auditor General.

Cuby Groove Music Festival

Council has decided to support an ambitious music festival scheduled for 13th and 14th September 2024. The festival will involve a nationally significant performer as a headline act supported by local acts on Saturday night, a concert for local performers on Friday night and a range of activities on the Saturday

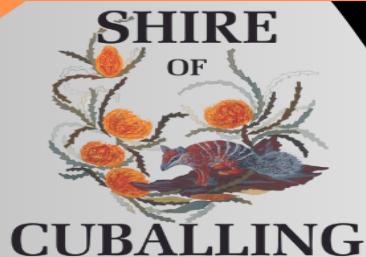

- Grass fires
- Garden refuse; and
- Large bonfires



Large fires will NOT be permitted from 8am Thursday 28th March to Midnight Monday April 1st. Large fires that are burning will need to be extinguished by 8am 28th March. This measure is essential to minimize the risk of fires and ensure the safety of The Shire of Cuballing.

The only exceptions will be made for fire pit usage, a permit is still required. However, please exercise extreme caution and adhere to safety guidelines of your permit.

River Restoration wrap up

March was a busy month on the banks of the Hotham and Williams Rivers, where bank rehabilitation was carried out at two locations, in partnership with the Wilman (Dryandra) People Corporation and thanks to assistance from the Shires of Wandering and Williams.

The purpose of the bank rehabilitation is to return the river to a stable environment that supports the natural function of the river whilst still allowing the community to access it. The two sites where this has occurred are Pumphreys Bridge on the Hotham River and a section of bank downstream of the Williams town weir on the Williams River.

The river banks have been gradually degraded over the years, with little native vegetation and areas of steep gradient, which have been gently re-sloped. Additional protection has been provided by strategically placing geofabric and rocks where needed. The rocks that have been used are of a size calculated to remain in place during seasons of high flow. These alterations on the river will provide ideal spots and niches for planting saline tolerant sedges, samphires, shrubs and scattered shade trees.

Pumphreys Bridge also had a set of 'bush steps' installed to allow people to continue accessing the river. In addition, large boulders have been placed approximately ten metres from the top-of-bank to prevent camping and parking too close to the river, for its ongoing protection.

Local elders from the Wilman (Dryandra) Corporation are partnering with PHCC on the project and were present during

the rehabilitation works to monitor for any potential artefacts. This is a commitment through the cultural heritage management plan developed for the site. Numerous approvals were granted for the works to occur including heritage (DPLH), beds and banks (DWER) and crown land approvals (DPLH).

We thank the Shires of Wandering and Williams for their contribution to the project through providing equipment and staff to conduct the earthworks component of the works under the guidance of an Environmental Engineer from Urbaqua and also PHCC staff.

The restoration process is a long term one, with ongoing weed control and revegetation occurring since 2022. Additional areas on the rivers will be identified in future years to have further rehabilitation carried out.

NBN Fixed Wireless network upgrades in the Shire of Cuballing starting soon

Work has continued on upgrades to the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network in the Wheatbelt, with work to upgrade the Cuballing and Popanyinning towers getting underway soon. The upgrade will benefit households and businesses across the south west, providing faster speeds and extending the coverage of the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network.

The \$750 million investment in the **nbn** Fixed Wireless and **nbn** Sky Muster satellite network - \$480 million from the Australian Government and \$270 million from **nbn** – is on track to be completed by December 2024.

When complete, the investment will expand the reach of the existing **nbn** Fixed Wireless footprint by up to 50%, as well as enabling two new high speed fixed wireless plans – Fixed Wireless Home Fast and Fixed Wireless Superfast. The additional capacity and reach available on the upgraded network will also enable approximately 120,000 existing Sky Muster satellite-only premises to access **nbn** Fixed Wireless for the first time.

Work has begun to enable the upgrades, including **nbn** introducing new technology and replacing some hardware on our fixed wireless towers.

The tower upgrades will mean some planned outages that may impact homes and businesses and their ability to use their **nbn** service while the work is underway. **nbn** will take all reasonable efforts to minimise service interruptions, however there are occasions where towers will be taken offline.

The upgrade work is scheduled to start on the Pingelly tower next month, and be followed by work on the Cuballing and Popanyinning towers. The tower works will not impact Sky Muster satellite services.

Impacted homes and businesses should be notified of any outages via their retail service provider.

Naomi Evans, head of nbn Local WA said:

“There is ever increasing demand for faster internet from homes and businesses across Australia and we are continuing to invest in the **nbn** network to stay ahead of demand.

“We are excited to soon commence work upgrading the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network in the Shire of Cuballing, which will be a game changer for up to a million households and businesses across Australia.

“These tower works are critical to the delivery of our program but will mean some planned outages that may affect homes and businesses and their ability to use their **nbn** service while the work is underway. After the tower works are completed, we expect that faster download speeds during the busy period will become available across the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network.

“We are asking the community to prepare for these outages and have back up connectivity if they need it.

“We encourage people to check the **nbn** website and watch out for communication from their retail service provider about how the planned outages may impact them.”

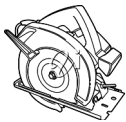
